Sacrament of Baptism

The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is administered upon request. Parents and Godparents must attend class on Baptism in the Catholic Church. Please contact the pastor or the office to set up an appointment for this class at least a month in advance. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic for their child to be baptized in the Catholic Church. Godparents must be at least 16 years of age, and at least one must be a practicing Catholic.

Is anyone sick/admitted in the hospital?

Sacrament of Penance

Sacrament of Penance is administered every Saturday at 3:00 pm or by appointment at St. Sebastian Church.

<u>Rite of Christian initiation of adults and children (RCIA):</u> Adults interested in becoming Catholic participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation (RCIA). The Rite of Christian Initiation is a process of initiation into the Catholic Community of Faith. This is for persons who are seeking baptism in the Catholic Church or full communion with the Catholic tradition through the Profession of Faith, reception of Eucharist and Confirmation. If you are interested, please call the office.

Sacrament of Marriage

A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months before the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the pastor. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter weekend of the Sponsor Couple Program.

Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

We began our journey of Lent five weeks ago on Ash Wednesday. As we received ashes on our foreheads, we acknowledged our human frailty and our need to repent with the words from the scriptures, *"Repent and believe in the Gospel."* On that day on wards, we were also encouraged to fast, pray, and give alms as a way to atone for our sins. Since then, for the past five weeks, we have been reflecting on different topics, where Jesus was calling us to be more vigilant and faithful by following His commands and listening to Him who speaks to us through the Word of God, sacraments, and everyone around us.

Today as we begin Holy Week, we are invited to deepen our spiritual commitment. The word "holy" means something that is dedicated to God or to religious service. Therefore, we should reflect on how well we have prepared ourselves to become holy to meet Jesus Christ more personally in our lives, especially during this holy week?

Today is Palm Sunday, a special day to remember how a Wonderful Man came to the holy city of Jerusalem on a donkey. Have you ever thought about-why Jesus picked a donkey instead of another animal? In those days, there were many wars between different kingdoms. They used horses or donkeys to travel and carry things. But there was a big difference between a king on a horse and a king on a donkey. A king travelling on a horse implied that he is ready to fight, but a king on a donkey means that he wanted peace. So, when Jesus rode a donkey, He was telling everyone that He came to bring peace, peace between God and His people.

Jesus uses an unused donkey for His traveling. It shows how Holy and Perfect the person of Jesus is! At the same time, we need to keep in mind that, we can carry Jesus only if we are holy. Jesus says to His disciples, "Go into the village opposite you, and as you enter it you will find donkey on which no one has ever sat. Untie it and bring it here. And if anyone should ask you, why are you untying it, you will answer The Master has need of it." Dear friends, we need to keep in mind that, in preparation for the Resurrection of our Lord, we are celebrating this great day of Palm Sunday. As Christians we believe that, through His resurrection, Christ is going to fully active and alive in this world and so we are as Christians called to be the carriers of Jesus in this world, and He needs a perfect and holy one and are you a perfect and holy one for Jesus? Very often just like the donkey we are all tied up in this world, in our own sins and many other things of this world. When Jesus asks His disciples to untie the donkey-it is directed towards you and me. Yes, we need to free ourselves from the clutches of sin and of this world

and only then can Jesus' travel with us, and work in our lives. As Jesus was talking about the fetching the donkey, the disciples were instructed that they are following the Master's need. In the same way Jesus needs us more than we need Him. He created us in His own image and likeness, so that we can be perfect and holy for His mission. He wants us to go around the world with Him. Are we ready for Jesus? Let us join Him in His journey to the Temple of Jerusalem and witness the honor He receives from the people!

There is a story about the donkey who carried Jesus to the temple in Jerusalem. The donkey was amazed by how everyone cheered for them on their way to the city. But after the donkey dropped off Jesus at the temple, the donkey thought he was still a big deal and tried to go back the same way, hoping to get more applause but he was wrong. The people didn't care about him at all. The donkey got mad and started making a lot of noise in the street, but that only made people angry. They came from all over and kicked him and chased him out of town. Well, this story is not just funny, it's also true for a lot of people. Some people think they can be awesome and do great things without God. Sure, they might succeed at some stuff, but it won't last, and it won't make them happy. In the end, they'll be sad, lonely, and stressed out. That's what happens when we don't have Jesus with us on our journey. We will end up like that poor donkey who got beat up and kicked out. If we want to have real peace in our life, we need to be willing to be a donkey for Jesus and carry him around. That's what the saints did, and that's why we honor them in our Catholic Church.

Yes, today Jesus needs you and I, to carry Him around. Are you ready to become a donkey for Jesus in this world? Today we held Palm in our hands and sang Hosana. The word Hosana means "save now", in truth how many of us really want to be saved by Jesus to save others and this world? Yes, Jesus is ready to save us, but we need to free ourselves from sin and be ready to become a donkey like. Yes, we should be ready to hate this world and its passions. Dear Friends, deep inside, we all long for salvation. May this Palm Sunday celebration, strengthen that longing, so that like the holy ones, we will become a vessel for Christ to spread his presence. **Amen**.
