The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter weekend of the Sponsor Couple Program.

#### Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

There is an ancient story about Jesus' ascension into heaven. The angel Gabriel came to Jesus and asked Him, "Now, you have finished your work here on earth and what plans have you made to continue your mission throughout the world?" Jesus answered, "I have called some fishermen and taxcollectors to walk along with me as I have done my Father's will." "Yes, I know about them," said Gabriel. "but what other plans have you made? "Jesus replied, "I taught Peter, James and John about the kingdom of God; I taught Thomas about faith; and all of them were with me as I healed and preached to the multitudes." Gabriel replied, "I know that, but do you have other plans to make sure your mission was not in vain." Jesus quietly replied to Gabriel, "I have no other plans. I am depending on them!! " The feast of the Ascension of the Lord reminds us that Jesus has not lost his hope in anyone of us. He still believes in us that we will carry out His mission in this world.

In the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles we see the Luke's description of the Ascension. Jesus led his disciples as far as Bethany on a mountain "As they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him from their sight." Then, they joyfully returned to Jerusalem praising God. In the second reading St. Paul reminds us that the glory the Father gave to Jesus is waiting for us after our death provided, we praise God through our lives here on earth. When we come to the Gospel reading, it explains to us, how we must be praising God in our lives, by being a Christ' witness to everyone.

Today, as we celebrate this great feast of our Lord, let us see the meaning of this feast and its significance for us today? Firstly, the Ascension is a glorification of Our Lord Jesus Christ, an event expected after his Resurrection. As a matter of fact, the Suffering, Death, Resurrection, and Ascension of Jesus and Pentecost are connected to each other. Moreover, the Ascension is a setting stage for Pentecost-for a new heart, a new spirit, and a new power of faith, which we will be celebrating next Sunday, where Jesus fulfills His promise to all of us that He will not leave us orphans.

Secondly, the Ascension marks the end of Jesus' earthly work of redemption, i.e., Jesus stopped appearing to His disciples and was not with them any more in a physical sense. But it did not mean that the mission of Jesus came to an end. In the Gospel reading of today, we hear that Jesus entrusted His mission to the disciples to continue - "All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and

and of the Holy Spirit...And behold, I will be with you always, until the end of the age." Today, this mission is ours, both as an individual and as a community of believers - as a Church. From this day of the Ascension onward the physical presence of Jesus Christ is over but a new form of experiencing Him always is made possible through the Sacraments we celebrate in the Holy Catholic Church.

Thirdly, the Ascension can also be seen as Jesus' parting from His disciples. In the 1st Reading of today we have the farewell scenario. This could had been a sad moment for the disciples; but Jesus fills them with joy through His parting gift of the Holy Spirit. Apart from the gifts of the Holy Spirit, the disciples were also given the glimpse and assurance of His second coming, "This Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven will return in the same way as you have seen Him going into heaven." Yes, as believers in Jesus Christ, all of us are waiting for the second coming of Jesus and our waiting can be a fruitful only as long as we are able to believe in the everlasting presence of Jesus with us through the power of the Holy Spirit and take up the mission that Jesus has entrusted to us personally. Just as Jesus enjoys the glory with His Father in Heaven, let us also strive hard during our lifetime to enjoy His glory by working along with His Spirit. Amen.
