#### **Sacrament of Baptism**

The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is administered upon request. Parents and Godparents must attend class on Baptism in the Catholic Church. Please contact the pastor or the office to set up an appointment for this class at least a month in advance. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic for their child to be baptized in the Catholic Church. Godparents must be at least 16 years of age, and at least one must be a practicing Catholic.

If anyone is sick or admitted in the hospital, please let Pastor know or call the office.

#### **Sacrament of Penance**

Sacrament of Penance is administered every Saturday at 4:30pm or by appointment at St. Sebastian Church.

<u>Rite of Christian initiation of adults and children (RCIA):</u> Adults interested in becoming Catholic participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation (RCIA). The Rite of Christian Initiation is a process of initiation into the Catholic Community of Faith. This is for persons who are seeking baptism in the Catholic Church or full communion with the Catholic tradition through the Profession of Faith, reception of Eucharist and Confirmation. If you are interested, please call the office.

#### Sacrament of Marriage

A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months before the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the pastor. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter weekend of the Sponsor Couple Program.



#### Dear friends in Jesus Christ,

As a Christian, how many of us feel that our Christian life is in danger? As a Christian, how many of us are ready to endanger our life for the sake of the Kingdom of God? If our answer to these two questions is No, no doubt our Christian life is only a name tag that we use in this world without understanding the value of this beautiful life God has given to us. It is about this that Jesus says through the Gospel of Matthew 7:6, "Do not give what is holy to the dogs; nor cast your pearls before swine, lest they trample them under their feet, and turn and tear you in pieces." No doubt, the name "Christianity" is a brand name and God has shared His brand name to be used in our lives by inviting us to become His children through the sacrament of Baptism. Today, it is our responsibility to keep up this brand name in this world without losing the quality. The only way to maintain the quality of the name Jesus or Christianity is to be like Jesus, in other words, be a person of love.

In today's world, the problem with most of us is that we like to be considered as an ordinary human being, but being called as Christian or as Catholic, we are an extra ordinary human being. Unless and until we change this ordinary human mentality, no Christ can be born in this world through our lives. The call of a Christian is not to be indifferent, but to be different. Highlighting the importance of the call we have received; Jesus reminds us about the very purpose of our Christian calling by saying- "be perfect just as your heavenly father is perfect." As Christians we should be known not by our family name or money or power or position in the society. but rather we should be a model for others or excel in our character of love. The only challenge the Gospel places before us is to love everyone.

Before we read through the Gospel again, please remember that we are not the children of the Old Testament, but we are the children of the NT. We are not the slave of the Jewish Law, but we are the children of the Covenantal Love of Jesus' precious Blood. But still, some of us continue to be part of the OT and slave of the Jewish Law. Today, many nations and people are working hard for peace among nations and within nations, but often their efforts find no good results, because we have chosen the wrong method to establish peace, through revenge, violence, and anger. Understanding our attitude rightly, Jesus says; "You have heard that it was said, an eve for an eve and a tooth for a tooth. But I say to you, offer no resistance to one who is evil ... ". Yes, Jesus says, be patient with everyone who provokes you. Again, Jesus says; "You have heard that it was said, you shall love your neighbor and hate vour enemy, but I say to you, love

your enemies and pray for those who persecute you..." Well, again Jesus says to us to be a person of love. Dear friends, it is not merely the words spoken out by Jesus, but it is the life of Jesus that He is speaking to us. He loved everyone personally without any discrimination; He never kept revenge or anger against anyone. Jesus loved Peter who denied Him three times, Jesus loved Judas who betrayed Him, and Jesus prayed for the people those who persecuted Him. Yes, the life of Jesus is a life of Love and forgiveness and that is the only reason today we are here in this Church. Jesus taught us only to love and gave permission only to love. But now, we need to answer a question - If Jesus has taught us and given us permission only to love one another, who taught us and gave permission to take revenge and be angry with our brothers and sisters? If we continue to live against the values of Jesus, He asks What is the difference we make as Christians in this world? How can we say that we have Faith in Jesus? How can we call ourselves a Christian? Jesus says, "Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you." God Bless you.
