

Dear friends in Jesus Christ,

In Last weekend, the Gospel invited us to reflect about the question "how faithful are we to the promises we have made to our God?" From the Book of Genesis, we are taught that God placed His trust in each of us and made us stewards of His creation (Gen 2:15). But, how many of us could faithfully fulfill the trust God has placed on us in caring for His creation?

The readings we have today speak about trouble, as well as the hope. In the first reading, prophet Isaiah talks about the imminent destruction of the vineyard, that is, "the house of Israel." In the Gospel, Jesus talks about a vineyard under terrible mismanagement of the unfaithful tenants. Rather than caring for the vineyard, the tenants get involved in greed, betrayal - and finally, murder. The first reading and the Gospel describe a world filled with trouble. Between those two readings, in the second reading St. Paul says, "Have no anxiety at all."

Dear friends, St. Paul is not just preaching, but he is convinced of his preaching, because he himself has gone through terrible difficulties in his life for the sake of Christ and was able to find peace within himself. From his own experience he tells us how to overcome anxiety: "in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God." His prescription against anxiety has two parts: First, prayer - putting our troubles in God's hand - making our requests known to him. Learn to pray like Jesus, because Jesus always found time to connect with His Heavenly Father and seek His will through prayers. The second part of the prescription is thanksgiving. Learn to thank like Jesus. We can see in many places Jesus is thanking His Father for the blessings. So in every situation-good or bad, we need to give thanks. A grateful heart is a peaceful heart.

Do you have a peaceful heart? If not, have you thought about-how and when you lost your peaceful heart? A serious examination of conscious will make us aware that it is when we go against the will of God; we lose peace in our lives. Going against the will of God is a clear expression of rejecting Jesus from our lives. Yes, missing the piece of Christ from our lives will result in missing peace. Remember the anxiety and worry Joseph and Mary went through after they found Jesus is not with them after the feast at Jerusalem temple. This is the same the Book of Revelations reminds us too; "But, I have this against you; that you have left your first love. Realize how far you have fallen. Repent and do the works you did at first. Otherwise, I will come to you and remove your lamp stand from its place, unless you repent." Gospel of today is a fulfillment of the book of Revelation.

Every unfaithful situation in our lives is the same as rejecting Jesus and His will for our lives, thereby we are in trouble and everything connected with us also will be in trouble. The only way to get out of our trouble is to repent and build our life and God's Kingdom with Jesus, not away from Jesus. This is the reason Jesus says; "The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone; by the Lord has this been done, and it is wonderful in our eyes." To make our lives wonderful in this world, let us build our lives on the corner stone called Jesus. **God Bless.**

Guidelines for Resuming Parish Gatherings Outside the Liturgy

Effective (July 1, 2020), parish gatherings outside the liturgy as well as non-parish sponsored events held by groups renting or using parish facilities or property.

- Limit the persons in attendance to no more than 50% of the maximum permitted occupancy capacity of the space.
- Maintain physical distance of six feet minimum from those not living within the same household.
- Wear face covering over mouth and nose. Based on CDC recommendations, everyone over the age of two must wear a mask for the duration of any event held on parish property if closer than six feet to anyone not living within the same household.
- Conduct temperature checks for each participant.
- Ensure proper, frequent cleaning and sanitation of the gathering space, including restrooms.
- Follow State of Kentucky **Healthy at Work Requirements for Restaurants and Bars** for any form of food service.
