

Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

“One who is coming after me is mightier than I, I am not worthy to untie the thongs of His sandals.” This is one of the most humbling words of St. John the Baptist about Jesus Christ. This is one of the most powerful testimonies of St. John the Baptist about Jesus. Normally, one who is coming after or behind is the disciple or a servant; but today, St. John the Baptist introduces Jesus as the most powerful. Today, we are all given the same responsibility as St. John the Baptist in the Gospel, but how many of us are humble enough accept and proclaim Jesus through our lives like St. John the Baptist? If we sincerely examine our lives, we can find; instead of being challenged by the life of Jesus, we challenge the life of Jesus in this world through our unworthy way of life. Yes, the creature challenges the creator-what a tragedy!

Today, we celebrate the feast of the Baptism of the Lord. With this celebration we wind up the Christmas season and enter into the ordinary season of our liturgical year. As we enter into the ordinary season, Jesus would like to come with us, and travel with us by being one among us by accepting the sacrament of Baptism from St. John the Baptist.

St. John the Baptist preached the Baptism of repentance and baptized many people with water. As Christians, our Baptism also is closely linked to the idea of forgiveness of sin. But, one might wonder why at all Jesus, who has no sin, needs to be baptized and asking for forgiveness. The answer to this question is well explained in St. Paul’s letter to Philippians 2:6-8 “*Though he was in the form of God, he did not count equality with God something to be grasped at. Rather, he emptied himself and took the form of a slave, being born in the likeness of men; and found human in appearance; he humbled himself, becoming obedient to death, even death on a cross*”. Yes, by being baptized by St. John the Baptist, Jesus tries to identify Himself with each one of us, to strengthen our relationship with His Father in Heaven, which is possible only by humbling ourselves to becoming a servant.

Even though, Jesus was baptized by St. John the Baptist by water, the completion of the sacrament of Baptism is seen only in Jesus with the descending of the Holy Spirit, and thereby we see the very purpose of the coming of the Holy Spirit is well expressed in the voice that came from heaven: “*You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased.*” These words from heaven indicate that everyone who receives and acts upon the spirit of the Lord is called beloved and through which God will be well pleased. Our Baptism is not different than the Baptism Jesus received, but do we live like the beloved of God and

please Him through our lives? If this purpose of Baptism is not fulfilled in our lives, what does it benefit us by receiving the sacrament of Baptism except the fact that we are called mere Christians without any quality?

“*You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased,*” is the welcome note from heaven to Jesus and Jesus accepted the invitation by being obedient to the will of His Father in Heaven until death-death on a cross. Jesus became a servant of the will of God through His humility and meekness. It is the same attitude Jesus calls us to have in our lives too, “*learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart.*” (Mt. 11:29). Yes, my dear friends, the sacrament of Baptism, and all other sacraments, call each one of us to be obedient to the will of God, and be a servant of God in this world, like St. John the Baptist, to prepare the people to welcome the Mighty One who is to come, rather than just being part of a big crowd called Christians. Dear friends, as we continue to celebrate this Holy Eucharist, let us ask for the grace of God to remain always the beloved of the Lord, by being obedient to His will always. **God Bless.**
