Today, we celebrate the solemnity of another great mystery of our spiritual life-the mysterious presence of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist or Corpus Christi. Just like any other mysteries of our spiritual journey, this mystery also can only be experienced personally not explained and understood fully. Yes, today we celebrate the feast of our Holy Eucharist. To, experience and understand this great mystery, it is important that we need the presence of the Holy Trinity in our lives; the wisdom from the Father, the Love of Jesus and the Holiness of the Holy Spirit.

The Gospel repeatedly reminds us that, God so loved the world and everything in it. Just like we take extra care to protect our belongings from all kinds of dangers, to protect Gods own or each one of us from all kinds of danger of sin, God sent His only Son Jesus to each one us. This is one of the greatest wisdom of God that we can see in the person of Jesus. He was found one among us with His human nature, but was different from all of us in sin. Without losing bit of love from the Father, Jesus tried to share the Love of God with everyone, but we never understood His ways or sought His ways in our lives. His love for us was so much that by following the will of His Father, Jesus sacrificed His life for us. The Love of God is everlasting and that did not end with the death of Jesus, but continue to live with us and nurture our lives through the Holy Eucharist. This living and nurturing experience will be possible only for those who believe in Him. This is what the Gospel reminds us too; *“whoever believes in him will not be condemned, but whoever does not believe has already been condemned...”* A very good example of condemnation we can see in the end moments of Judas Iscariot, that without proper disposition of heart he shared the table with Jesus and darkness entered into his life and he killed himself.

Dear friends, as we celebrate this great solemnity of God’s unconditional love of God, the feast of Holy Eucharist, the question to be asked personally is, do I have an unconditional love for God? Do I really and sincerely believe that there is the real presence of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist? When I share this Eucharistic table of the Lord, do I have a holiness of heart and experience Jesus through this Holy Eucharist? If someone says that they cannot believe the presence of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist, because they cannot see with their naked eyes, the simple question to be reflected and asked is-how can you or they believe the presence of corona virus in this

present world which no one can see with their naked eyes? Yes, the only approach to mystery is nothing but to believe. Let us ask the Holy Spirit to teach us to believe the unconditional love of God for each one of us thorough Jesus Christ, which He continues to share through the Holy Eucharist. **Amen.**

Guidelines for Resuming Parish Gatherings Outside the Liturgy

Effective immediately (May 27, 2020), parish gatherings outside the liturgy (Religious Education classes, RCIA meetings, small groups, etc.) may resume with ten people or less, with the following guidelines:

- All must continue practicing physical distancing of six feet from those not living within the same household.
- All must wear a mask if closer than six feet to anyone not living within their household.
- No communal food may be shared.
- Encourage all to wash hands frequently before, during, and after the gathering.
- Encourage all to avoid touching their eyes, nose, and mouth.
- Those at high risk over 65 with heart, lung, or kidney disease, are still asked not to gather.
