Sacrament of Baptism
The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is administered upon request. Parents and Godparents must attend class on Baptism in the Catholic Church. Please contact the pastor or the office to set up an appointment for this class at least a month in advance. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic for their child to be baptized in the Catholic Church. Godparents must be at least 16 years of age, and at least one must be a practicing Catholic.

Is anyone sick/admitted in the hospital?
If anyone is sick or admitted in the hospital, please let Pastor know or call the office.

Sacrament of Penance
Sacrament of Penance is administered every Saturday at 4:30pm or by appointment at St. Sebastian Church.

Rite of Christian initiation of adults and children (RCIA):
Adults interested in becoming Catholic participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation (RCIA). The Rite of Christian Initiation is a process of initiation into the Catholic Community of Faith. This is for persons who are seeking baptism in the Catholic Church or full communion with the Catholic tradition through the Profession of Faith, reception of Eucharist and Confirmation. If you are interested, please call the office.

Sacrament of Marriage
A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months before the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the pastor. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter weekend of the Sponsor Couple Program.



Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

After the celebration of Corpus Christi on this past Sunday and inviting us to become a Eucharist, in today's Gospel we see that Jesus is sending His disciples to become a Eucharist, so to say to become a blessing to others life. Jesus gave them authority over unclean spirits to drive them out and to cure every disease and every illness and sends them by instructing them, "Do not go into pagan territory or enter a Samaritan town. Go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. As you go make this proclamation: 'The kingdom of heaven is at hand. 'Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse lepers, drive out demons.'"

Just like you and I feel pity for the world and unfortunate things happening around the world, in the Gospel of today we see that Jesus feels the same for you and me, because we are not living the way Jesus wants us to live. The Gospel states that, "Jesus' heart was moved with pity for them because they were troubled and abandoned, like sheep without a shepherd." As we reflect about this Gospel passage, how many of us can sincerely say that Jesus is happy with your life?

There was a little girl whose parents were very poor. This little girl was so good that everyone in that little village loved her so much. As she grew up, she expressed her desire to learn dancing. As her parents were not able to afford to send her for a dancing class, they discouraged her, but they failed to convince her and finally they agreed to send her for dancing class. After a couple of years, the girl was ready for her graduation. The whole village decided to make her graduation a big celebration. So, they rented a big hall for her graduation ceremony. The day has arrived, and the girl is asked to perform a dance before the whole audience. She performed a great dance before the audience that the whole crowd stood and clapped their hands. She was so happy, but suddenly her happy face became so sad and started crying. Her parents ran to the stage to console her and asked her the reason for her crying. After some time, she replied, "You all stood up and cheered for me by clapping your hands with a smiling face after my dance performance, but the master who taught me dancing is standing at the back of the hall watching me dancing did not have a smiling face and did not clap for me. If he is not happy, I cannot be happy."

Dear friends, being a Catholic every one of us is called to be a good teacher to others, to teach about Jesus and lead others to the Kingdom of God. Before we evaluate the performance of others, a self-evaluation is must-Have I lived as a good teacher to my kids, or do I live as a good teacher to my kids and discipline them and teach them the way Jesus wants

us to? Every bit of our thoughts, words and action in this world is our performance in this world-how many of us can sincerely say that Jesus, the Master is happy with our performance in this world? Jesus says to His disciples very clearly, "Do not go into pagan territory or enter a Samaritan town. Go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. As you go make this proclamation: 'The kingdom of heaven is at hand. 'Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse lepers, drive out demons.'" Jesus and His disciples were Jews. By this instruction to His disciples Jesus makes it clear that the evangelization should start from one's own house. Yes, let us evangelize one own self and our family members and preach to them the Gospel that, "The Kingdom of God is at hand, repent and believe in the Gospel." How many of us are ready to take up this evangelization method and make changes in their family? Remember, our Church is the family of families. So, the evangelization of the Church depends on the evangelization of each one of us and our family. It is when you and I are ready for this mission, we become another Eucharist in this world. **God Bless.**
