Sacrament of Baptism

The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is administered upon request. Parents and Godparents must attend class on Baptism in the Catholic Church. Please contact the pastor or the office to set up an appointment for this class at least a month in advance. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic for their child to be baptized in the Catholic Church. Godparents must be at least 16 years of age, and at least one must be a practicing Catholic.

Sacrament of Penance

Sacrament of Penance is administered every Saturday at 4:30pm or by appointment at St. Sebastian Church.

<u>Rite of Christian initiation of adults and children (RCIA):</u> Adults interested in becoming Catholic participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation (RCIA). The Rite of Christian Initiation is a process of initiation into the Catholic Community of Faith. This is for persons who are seeking baptism in the Catholic Church or full communion with the Catholic tradition through the Profession of Faith, reception of Eucharist and Confirmation. If you are interested, please call the office.

Sacrament of Marriage

A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months before the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the pastor. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter weekend of the Sponsor Couple Program.

Dear friends in Jesus Christ,

The three readings of last weekend taught us how to achieve happiness in our lives. The first reading taught us to seek God with great humility and serve God by obeying His commandments. Through the second reading St. Paul reminded us to seek the grace of God and to follow the values of Jesus rather than the world. It was through the Gospel Jesus invited all of us to assume His attitude (beatitudes) in our lives to be happy always in this troubled world. There is no doubt, more than we follow Jesus, Jesus is following us wherever we go. Today, Jesus is coming behind us through the Gospel reading and reminds us that, it is not enough that we continue to live happily in this world, but we also have a responsibility to make others life happy.

To fulfill our responsibility to make our brothers and sisters happy, Jesus asks to do the functions of two little things of this world: salt and light. Jesus says, "You are the salt of the earth and You are the light of the world." Today, Jesus is taking the role of a physics professor. It is a human tendency that we don't care about the value of things that we use in our daily lives. Salt and light seem to be two simple things, but can we imagine our life without them? Remember, how irritated we would be if we do not have both, no salt in the food and no light in the night! Yes, as both salt and light are very much needed in our lives, the life of every Christian is very much needed in this world, to make this world into His kingdom. Yes, the life of Christ may not be a matter to our life in this world, but your life and my life matters so much to Jesus in this world. This is what through the Book of Isaiah 43:4 our Lord says, "Because you are precious in my eyes, and honored and I love you..." These words express the quality of love our Lord has for us, which He has given to us all, but do we have the same quality of love towards Him? The quality of God's love for us never fades away, even if we inflict pain upon Him, but how about our love for God and our brothers and sisters?

Jesus says, "You are the salt of the earth. But if salt loses its taste, with what can it be seasoned? It is no longer good for anything but to be thrown out and trampled underfoot." The first function of the salt is to makes the food taste better. Apart from adding more taste to the food, the salt has another important function which many younger generations people may not know. In olden days, also in Jesus' time, salt was commonly used as one of the preservatives. Today, as Jesus compares our life with salt it reminds us of two important responsibilities we must do in this world; first to add taste to the life of the people and secondly to be their guardian. In short, be a good steward of God's creation. After mixing the salt with the food, we see that the salt loses its its identity and only the taste remains with the food. The same way after we do our responsibility like the salt, let us shed our identity and let the quality (Jesus) be alive in this world. This is what St. Paul says to Colossians 3:17 *"whatever you do, in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him."* Jesus also reminds us that if the salt loses its quality, it is good for nothing. The same way, if a Christian loses his/her quality, his or her life will be good for nothing in this world. Remember, when we Christians loses our quality, the world loses its quality. *"Repent, and believe in the Gospel"*, is the only way to increase the quality of our lives.

Jesus says, "You are the light of the world." By comparing us with the light, Jesus also explains to us what is expected from us; "your light must shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your heavenly Father." Yes, we have a greater responsibility to lead others to Christ. Just like the star that appeared and became a navigator to the magi to find Jesus in Bethlehem, let us be a beckon of light to those who live in the darkness of sin. Yes, let the light of Christ shine through us. Let us not forget that, in some parts of the world there are some unknown people living the life of Christ, living like salt and light for this world, proclaiming only Jesus not themselves. The reminder of Jesus is YOU ARE THE SALT OF THE EARTH, and YOU ARE THE LIGHT OF THE WORLD. **God Bless**
