Sacrament of Marriage

A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months before the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the pastor. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter weekend of the Sponsor Couple Program.

Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

The Gospel of today talks to us about the transformation of the Samaritan woman, who is a public sinner, by the transfigured Jesus of last weekend. There is no doubt; the public life of Jesus was a challenging one for those who considered Him seriously, because He challenged everyone. He not only challenged His listeners, but His disciples too. Today, looking sincerely into one's own heart and life, how many of us can proudly say that I am challenged by Jesus and His life? I am sure, in most of our cases, instead of being challenged by Jesus, we are challenging Jesus in every way possible through our sinful life. Dear friends, how long will we challenge Jesus like this? It is good to remember that the day will come that we will never be able to challenge Jesus, but that day Jesus will challenge us with His questions! To avoid that situation Jesus said to us on the first day of lent- "Repent and Believe in the Gospel."

When we read through the Gospels, in many places we can see that Jesus is talking against and breaking many Jewish customs and traditions, which stood against the dignity of human beings. In today's Gospel, also we can see such an event where Jesus is interacting with a Samaritan woman publicly. In Jesus time, men never interacted with any woman in public and even more Jews and Samaritans were great enemies. However, in the Gospel we see that Jesus is interacting with a Samaritan woman publicly. Jesus, who came to save the whole humanity without any discrimination did not have any hesitation to talk with the Samaritan woman publicly. Thus, Jesus was trying to become a bridge between the Samaritans and the Jews.

"Give me a drink" is the request of Jesus to the Samaritan woman. This same kind of request we can see at the end of Jesus' life on the cross. "He said, I am thirsty." Though both requests of Jesus appear to be out of His physical need, in truth His request is for you and me, for the true repentance of our hearts. This is the truth Jesus says to us through the Gospel of Luke 5: 32, "I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners, to repentance." When the woman was asked to give some water, she was not quite happy. The same way, when Jesus said- He is thirsty, the soldiers offered him a sponge filled with vinegar. The woman and the soldiers represent you and I in today's world. Yes, Jesus is very thirsty in this world and how many of us are ready to quench His thirst with our true love for Him?

Jesus asked for a drink and in return He offered her living water that would lead her to eternal life, which she did not understand at first. Yes, there is no life without water. Similarly, we Christians had our

beginning of Christian life, in the life of grace through the waters of Baptism. Secondly, we see the woman gradually coming to know Jesus in a fuller and deeper way. She initially addresses Jesus as "Sir", a polite title to address a stranger. Secondly, she sees Him as a Prophet and, thirdly she begins to believe that He is the Christ, the Messiah. The very moment she realizes that Jesus is the Messiah; she becomes a new creation in Jesus and ran to town to tell everyone about Him. Thus, this Samaritan woman becomes the first missionary to preach to others that Jesus is the Messiah, even before His Passion, Death, and Resurrection.

All the transformations in the life of the Samaritan woman started with her willingness to talk with Jesus, which led her to know that Jesus is the Messiah. The same way, we will never be able to get to know our Lord, if we don't find time to talk to Him. Yes, dear friends, Jesus is talking to us daily through the Word of God, and we need to talk to Him by living the Word of God. Are you ready for this challenge? Yes, Christian life is full of challenges and to become a true Christian we should be ready to take up every challenge in our lives. This is the reason Jesus says, "whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross and follow me."
