The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter weekend of the Sponsor Couple Program.

Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

It was in the year 2000, St. Pope John Paul II canonized St. Faustina, and made the second Sunday of Easter to be celebrated as Divine Mercy Sunday. St. Faustina was a Polish nun gifted with mystical visions, messages, and revelations from the Risen Jesus. This feast reminds us that our life is a gift of God's mercy through Jesus' passion, death, and resurrection. St. Faustina wrote in her diary, "Proclaim that mercy is the greatest attribute of God. All God's works are crowned with mercy" (no. 301). This is the same as the Psalmist says in 130:3, "If you, Lord, keep account of sins, Lord, who can stand? But with you is forgiveness and so you are revered." God forgives no matter the depth of one's sin. There are many parables in the Gospels which gives us a good idea of the depth of God's forgiveness. As a believer in Jesus, we should proclaim God's mercy, not only in words but also in deeds like the early Christian community.

In the first reading, the early Christian community sets a good example for us. "The community of believers shared all their possessions in common. They brought them to the Apostles, and they were distributed to each according to need" (Acts 4:32-35). We are invited to imitate the early Christian community. Jesus teaches us to be merciful even to our enemies. Jesus says, "Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you."

The image of the Divine Mercy of Jesus showing two rays, one reddish (symbolizing blood) and the other whitish (symbolizing water), with the words "Jesus, I trust in you" at the bottom. This is one of St. Faustina's visions. The image takes us back to the passion, crucifixion, and death of Jesus. When the soldier pierced the side of Jesus, "immediately blood and water flowed out." St. John says in the second reading, "This is the one who came through water and blood, Jesus Christ, not by water alone, but by water and blood." Jesus said during the Last Supper. "This is my blood of the new covenant, which will be shed for many for the forgiveness of sins." The blood of the new covenant means the physical blood Jesus shed on the cross for us, and the sacramental blood present in the Eucharist.

Reflecting on the Gospel, I am sure the disciples must have been suffering from a severe depression since Good Friday. Jesus was dead. The crowd that welcomed them along with Jesus to Jerusalem with palms have turned against Him on Good Friday. The apostles are now scared and finding their own protection in the closed room. There were ten of them in the closed room, Judas was no more, and Thomas was temporarily absent. It was to their state of fear Jesus came with His mercy and healing saying, "Peace be with you."

Thomas came back to their group and the other disciples told him about their new experience that they had seen Jesus alive. However, Thomas was not willing to accept their claim and demanded proof: "Unless I see the holes that the nails made in his hands and can put my finger into the holes they made, and unless I can put my hand into his side, I refuse to believe." Thomas does not have faith, yet he is depending on reason alone but within a week we will see that faith and reason will be perfectly blended in Thomas. The following Sunday Jesus came again even though the doors were closed. Jesus again wished them peace and provided Thomas with the proof that he was asking for, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe." Thomas replied acknowledging his mistake, "My Lord and my God."

Dear friends, by relying only on reason and science Thomas closed his mind to Jesus' resurrection and lost him a week to experience the Risen Lord. Let us examine, how many times we have acted like St. Thomas and wasted our time to experience the risen Lord because of our ignorance, negligence, and carelessness? For the times we have failed, wasted our time to experience the Lord through sacraments, word of God and in others, let us be sorry and fall into the Mercy of God like St. Thomas, "My Lord and My God." God Bless.
