Sacrament of Baptism
The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is administered upon request. Parents and Godparents must attend class on Baptism in the Catholic Church. Please contact the pastor or the office to set up an appointment for this class at least a month in advance. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic for their child to be baptized in the Catholic Church. Godparents must be at least 16 years of age, and at least one must be a practicing Catholic.

If anyone is sick or admitted in the hospital, please let Pastor know or call the office.

Sacrament of Penance
Sacrament of Penance is administered every Saturday at 3:00 pm or by appointment at St. Sebastian Church.

Rite of Christian initiation of adults and children (RCIA):
Adults interested in becoming Catholic participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation (RCIA). The Rite of Christian Initiation is a process of initiation into the Catholic Community of Faith. This is for persons who are seeking baptism in the Catholic Church or full communion with the Catholic tradition through the Profession of Faith, reception of Eucharist and Confirmation. If you are interested, please call the office.

Sacrament of Marriage
A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months before the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the pastor. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter weekend of the Sponsor Couple Program.

Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

We remember that parables are earthly stories with a heavenly meaning. Jesus' parables are always designed to shock us into thinking in a different way than what we are used to think normally. Today, as we listen to this parable, many of us may raise our eyebrows and would say it is not fair. Because, in a county like the United States most of the workers are paid based on the number of hours they work, but today Jesus breaks all barriers and understanding of payment for the job. Yes, Jesus is trying to provoke our thinking through this parable and if you are provoked, be sure the real purpose of this Gospel is working within in you.

Growing up in a large, traditional, farming family has its advantages. When the crop is ready for harvest, the whole family is out in the field working together. They do not work at the same pace. Dad and big brother would be in the field very early while little sister is still asleep. Mom and little sister would join them in the farm later. You see, dad and big brother go to work without breakfast, but little sister would not go anywhere without breakfast. When she finally arrives in the field, she is more interested in asking silly questions and distracting the workers than in the work itself. At the end of the day all go home happy together. Supper is prepared and served. Does anyone suggest that you eat as much as you have worked? Not at all! Often the same little sister who did the least work is pampered with the best food. Yet no one complains, no one is jealous, and everyone is happy.

In today's Gospel we hear of a harvest in which some workers put in more work than others. When pay time comes, they are all treated equally and the early birds among them begin to complain and grumble. Why do the workers in the vineyard grumble and complain whereas the workers in the family do not? The answer is simple. One group of workers is made up of family members and others of unrelated individuals drawn from the wider society. So, the question that the parable poses to each one of us today is "Do we see ourselves as family with a common purpose or do we see ourselves as a bunch of individuals, each with their own agenda? We call ourselves brothers and sisters. Why then do we often see and treat one another as rivals and competitors?"

The notion of the Kingdom of God as family is central to understanding this parable. The kingdom of God is a family more than a society. A society is characterized by they-and-them, by rivalry and survival of the fittest. A family, on the other hand, is we and not they or them. It is characterized by a spirit of co-operation rather than competition and

and supported by generous love and understanding of each other.

Yes, certainly the Gospel of today and especially the dealing of the landowner is really embarrassing to most of us as human beings as he is paying the same amount of money to all workers, even to those who came at the last hour. But by presenting this parable, Jesus wants to tell the individuals of the society that God's ways are not the same as human ways. God does not work according to the world's standards, but God operates on the principle of grace and generosity. The Kingdom of God is not something that you can earn by your ability or hard work or argument, but it is purely a gift of God, that God gives generously to whomever He wishes.

Finally, as the members of the church, it is time to evaluate our attitude. Do we really feel the belongingness of a family member to your parish with understanding and generosity in all the activities of the Church? Or do we act like different individuals each with their own agenda? Remember God unites, but Evil separates. **God Bless you all.**

Our Lady of Fatima

The Blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of God, appeared six times to three shepherd children near the town of Fatima, Portugal between May 13th and October 13th, 1917. Appearing to the children, the Blessed Virgin told them that She had been sent by God with a message for every man, woman and child living in our century. Coming at a time when civilization was torn asunder by war and bloody violence, She promised that Heaven would grant peace to all the world if Her requests for prayer, reparation and consecration were heard and obeyed. In all Her appearances at Fatima, the Blessed Mother repeatedly emphasized the necessity of praying the [Rosary daily](#), of wearing the [Brown Scapular](#) of Mount Carmel and of performing acts of reparation and sacrifice. To prevent the terrible chastisement at the hands of Russia and to convert "that poor nation", Our Lady requested the solemn public Consecration of Russia to Her Immaculate Heart by the Pope and all the Catholic bishops of the world. She also asked that the Faithful practice a new devotion of reparation on the first Saturday of five consecutive months. ("[The Five First Saturdays](#)")
