This is for persons who are seeking baptism in the Catholic Church or full communion with the Catholic tradition through the Profession of Faith, reception of Eucharist and Confirmation. Sacrament of Marriage

A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months before the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the pastor. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter weekend of the Sponsor Couple Program.

Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

As we continue to journey in the Easter season the preaching mission of each of us is to continue to proclaim the Risen Lord. Today, through the celebration of the Eucharist, we affirm that Jesus is the sacrificed Lamb. Hence, He is worthy to be given all power, honor, and glory. Thus, today both the first and the second readings bear great testimonies to the greatness of Christ.

In the first reading, taken from the Acts of the Apostles, we see how the Holy Spirit transformed Peter, from a fearful man to a courageous man whom Jesus had appointed as the head of the Church. Being filled with the Holy Spirit, the apostles continued to bear witness to the Risen Lord through their preaching and teaching, miracles and healings with great courage. Despite all the humiliations and threats to their lives, they continued their ministry. Fear now belongs to the past, that Peter stands before the Jewish Supreme Court-the Sanhedrin, and tells the High Priest, "We are witnesses of Jesus" resurrection and we are all called upon to obey God rather than men." This strong conviction and the proclamation of the apostles reminds us that obedience to God is the same as faithfulness to our own vocations as Christians and to witness to Christ. The second reading, taken from the book of Revelation presents John's vision of the Risen Lord as the glorified "Lamb of God," enthroned in Heaven. The whole book of Revelation is an invitation to place our trust in the Risen Lord.

When we come to the Gospel reading, we see Jesus appears to His apostles for the third time. This time it was in the place of their "fishing business." Just imagine the frustration and the embarrassment of the disciples! Despite their fishing experience and skills, they could not catch any fish. This is because they abandoned their actual business and mission. They acted contrary to Christ's mission statement for them: "From today you will no longer catch fishes, I will make you fishers of men" (Mt 4, 9). Yes, the disciples were supposed to be taking care of the Lord's business and their business.

The second part of the Gospel is a dialogue between the Risen Lord and Peter where Peter is asked three times: "Simon son of John, do you love me? Feed my lambs. Look after my sheep." By asking this question, the Lord is making sure of Peter's commitment to lead his flock. The mission entrusted to Peter is an important one and that is why Jesus Christ asks him three times. It was a way of reminding us that: "To whom much is given, much is expected." Hence, Christ reminds us that our vocation is essential. He also reminds us that we must be ready to accept

every kind of humiliation for the good news as His disciples.

There are many other lessons to learn today. We need to open our eyes, ears, and hearts wide to see, hear, and experience the Risen Lord coming into our lives in many ways. At times, we abandon our vocations for other "more interesting things or places." Unfortunately, instead of progressing, we become frustrated like Peter and his companions. It is a lesson for all of us. Whenever we abandon the will of God and our vocation, we may labor in vain "all night long." Also, when we depend solely on our human ability or senses rather than on the spirit of God, success might escape from us. So, we must not forget the words of Christ, "Apart from me, you can do nothing." (Jn 15:5)

Finally, as Christ revealed himself to His disciples through the sacrifice of bread and wine, every day, He continues to show Himself to us through the Holy Eucharist and ordinary things of life. Therefore, at Mass, simple things like bread and wine help us to discover the presence of the Lord among us despite our infidelity and weakness. Yes, Christ is present in the Holy Eucharist, in the Word of God, in the sacraments and He is there where two or three are gathered in His name. So, let us encounter the Risen Lord through our faith in Him and be a great witness to His everlasting Love. **God Bless.**
