Sacrament of Marriage

A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months before the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the pastor. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter weekend of the Sponsor Couple Program.

Dear friends in Jesus Christ,

The Gospel of today is a continuation of last weekend's Gospel, which is Jesus's farewell discourse to His disciples on the night before His crucifixion. As we approach the feast of Pentecost, the Church invites us to celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit. She calls us to celebrate the Spirit of truth who strengthens us in the proclamation of the good news. If we go back to the Gospel of last weekend, we will see that the Gospel ended with a missionary promise of Jesus, "Amen, amen, I say to you, whoever believes in me will do the works that I do and will do greater ones than these."

Today, as we listen to the first reading, we see that the promise Jesus had given in last weekend's Gospel is happening in the missionary works of the Apostles. The first reading says that, through the preaching of Philip, the people of Samaria accepted the Word of God and received the sacrament of Baptism. Also on this day, Peter performed his episcopal function by laying hands upon the new converts too. Since Philip baptized new converts, why did he not confirm them? Why was it necessary for Peter and John to travel that long a distance? An understanding of our Catechism of the Catholic Church is very important here. By inviting Peter by Philip (the chief Shepherd of the Apostles), was absolutely in line with the Church's teaching on Confirmation: "The ordinary minister of the Sacrament of Confirmation is the bishop. If the need arises. He may grant the faculty to priests, although, it is fitting that he confers it himself mindful that the celebration of Confirmation has been temporarily separated from baptism for this reason. Bishops are the successors of the apostles" (CCC 1313). The Samaritans needed the Holy Spirit as much as we do today because, it is the Holy Spirit that strengthens and makes one a true soldier of Christ (CCC 1303-4). He helps us to bear witness to the truth without fear.

When we come to the second reading, Peter is asking us to have reverence for Christ, by being proud of living for Christ. He also reminded us to be kind and more merciful to those who ignore the Gospel we preach, "for it is better to suffer for doing good, if that is the will of God, than for doing evil."

As we are a couple of weeks away from Pentecost, through the Gospel of today Jesus promises us the Holy Spirit. However, He gives a condition for receiving the Holy Spirit: "If you love me, you will keep my commandments." When we do this, he adds: "I shall ask the Father and he will give you another Advocate to be with you forever, that spirit of truth...I will not leave you orphans." What is this commandment that we must keep to receive the Spirit of truth? According to John, the greatest

commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another. This is how all will know that you are my disciples if you have love for one another." (13:34-35). How can the disciples love one another as Jesus has loved them? Washing of the feet of His own disciples is the "full extent" of His love and He urged them to do the same for the others too. Yes, to be at the service of God and others. When we do this, we are certainly preaching the good news of truth. The advocate will come to strengthen us in the way of truth. He will also come to confirm that, we are sons of God.

Thus, the main message to be learned from today's gospel is that we all should believe in the protective care of God through the gift of the Holy Spirit. At the very moment that we decided to give our lives to Christ, Jesus has given us His Holy Spirit, as He had promised, as a friend and permanent companion. Hence, as we go about our daily lives, we must believe that we have a friend in us and walking with us always, in the person of the Holy Spirit, who knows what we are doing and is always willing to help us. At the same time, we must continually and personally invoke, invite, and call upon the Holy Spirit to come to our aid, to stay with us, to guide us, to enlighten us, and to give us the knowledge and wisdom to discern what is right, pure, holy, and just, as well as the courage to do the things God wants us to do. God Bless.
