Please contact the pastor or the office to set up an appointment for this class at least a month in advance. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic for their child to be baptized in the Catholic Church. Godparents must be at least 16 years of age, and at least one must be a practicing Catholic.</p> <p>Is anyone sick/admitted in the hospital? If anyone is sick or admitted in the hospital, please let Pastor know or call the office.</p> <p>Sacrament of Penance Sacrament of Penance is administered every Saturday at 4:30pm or by appointment at St. Sebastian Church.</p>	<p>Rite of Christian initiation of adults and children (RCIA): Adults interested in becoming Catholic participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation (RCIA). The Rite of Christian Initiation is a process of initiation into the Catholic Community of Faith. This is for persons who are seeking baptism in the Catholic Church or full communion with the Catholic tradition through the Profession of Faith, reception of Eucharist and Confirmation. If you are interested, please call the office.</p> <p>Sacrament of Marriage A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months before the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the pastor. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter weekend of the Sponsor Couple Program.</p>

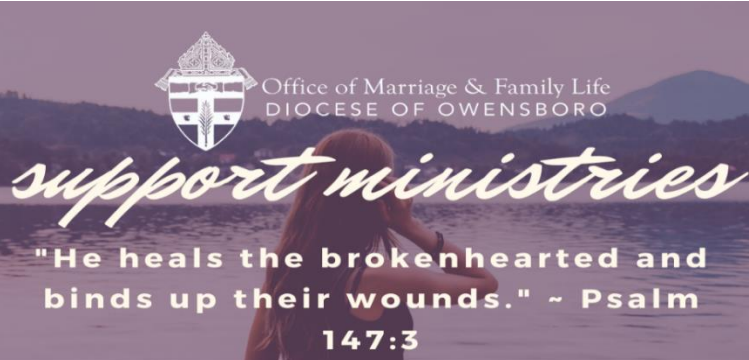
Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

When we celebrated the solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord into heaven in the last weekend, through the Gospel, Jesus had reminded us about the importance of continuing His mission in this world by saying; "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." Jesus not only entrusted this great responsibility to His disciples and each of us, but He also promised us His great support; "And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." Yes, this great promise of Jesus is made possible this Pentecost Sunday by sending the Holy Spirit upon His timid disciples, who gathered behind the closed doors for fear of the Jews. Jesus says, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when He had said this, He breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained." Through this new experience of the Holy Spirit, the disciples will no longer going to be the disciples of Jesus, but they became the Apostles of Jesus Christ. A great transformation happened in the life of the disciples. The disciples who were hiding themselves behind the doors for fear of the Jews came out of the room and went around the world and preached the Good News of the Kingdom of God and committed themselves to their mission.

Although we celebrate this Sunday as Pentecost Sunday, more than the Church celebration, we as Christians / Catholic should consider this celebration as a personal celebration by allowing the Holy Spirit to come into our lives and change our lives for Christ more than for the world. Yes, the world needs apostles more than the disciples. The disciples of Jesus had many failures while they were following Jesus. Even after the death of Jesus it was the fear of Jews that was controlling them more than Jesus. But, from the moment they received the Holy Spirit they began to create History for the Kingdom of God. Today, if we examine our lives, we will see that most of us continue to live as the disciples of Jesus Christ through the sacrament of Baptism. Though most of us have received the sacrament of confirmation, how many of us live in conformity with the spirit of the sacrament of confirmation is the question we should be asking on this day. Do we proclaim Christ and His values to our family members, friends, and dear and near ones enough and courageously? There is no doubt, by just praying, 'Thy kingdom come, and thy will be done,' through the prayer of the "Our Father" no Kingdom of God is going to be established unless and until we decided to change our spiritual status from a disciple to an apostle of Jesus Christ.

Jesus is ready to upgrade our spiritual life from a

disciple to an apostle, but how many of us are ready? The Gospel says, "He breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained." Believe it or not, the breath of Jesus is working in all of us and precisely because of the same reason we are all present here. Place your hand on your chest and you can feel the breath of Jesus. Reminding us about His breath in all of us, Jesus also reminds us about the importance of forgiveness in our lives. Yes, forgiveness is a conditional demand as well as unconditional demand from Jesus for a peaceful life. Through the prayer of 'Our Father' Jesus teaches us that our sins will be forgiven only as long as we are ready to forgive the sins of others. At the same time, He also teaches us that we should be ready to forgive our brothers and sisters endlessly. Yes, unforgiveness is the stumbling block to peace in this world. It is the unforgiving nature of human beings that created this present broken world. It was at the most needed time of Jesus' life the disciples ran away from Him. However, Jesus was ready to forgive them and so He willingly came back to them through His resurrection and strengthened them with His promise and said, "Peace be with you." No doubt, often we have run away from Jesus like the disciples, but it is time for us to repent and come back to Him and receive His Spirit in our lives and share His Spirit of Peace to everyone in this world.
