The poor man was very honest, sincere and very generous towards the needy though he was very poor. Both of them died and both of them were taken to Heaven and St. Peter took both of them for site seeing in the heaven. At the end of the sightseeing, St. Peter showed them their houses to stay in heaven. The poor man was given a big house with all latest facilities and seeing this, the rich man thought he is going to get a house bigger than that. But surprisingly the rich man was showed to take a hut to live in the heaven. The rich man was furious and got angry with St. Peter and blamed him for not doing justice to him. Peter politely replied to him that, when you were on earth you had everything that you wanted in your life, and from your way of life you sent materials to heaven only to build hut for you, whereas the poor man, in spite of his poverty, through his way of life he sent plenty of material to heaven and with that I could build this big house for him.

Yes, my dear friends, the earth is the place where you can make your decision, to what type of life we should have after our death. When John was making comment about others. Jesus teaches them about intolerance and reminded them that, anyone doing anything in the name of the Lord will be rewarded in heaven. Later we see the strong warning of Jesus against giving scandal, especially to innocent children, vulnerable members of the community and beginners in the faith. Jesus tells them in strong words that, it is better to be get lost from this world than leading a scandalous life to others. By this Jesus gives us the message
