Sacrament of Baptism

The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is administered upon request. Parents and Godparents must attend class on Baptism in the Catholic Church. Please contact the pastor or the office to set up an appointment for this class at least a month in advance. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic for their child to be baptized in the Catholic Church. Godparents must be at least 16 years of age, and at least one must be a practicing Catholic.

Is anyone sick/admitted in the hospital?

Sacrament of Penance

Sacrament of Penance is administered every Saturday at 3:00 pm or by appointment at St. Sebastian Church.

<u>Rite of Christian initiation of adults and children (RCIA):</u> Adults interested in becoming Catholic participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation (RCIA). The Rite of Christian Initiation is a process of initiation into the Catholic Community of Faith. This is for persons who are seeking baptism in the Catholic Church or full communion with the Catholic tradition through the Profession of Faith, reception of Eucharist and Confirmation. If you are interested, please call the office.

Sacrament of Marriage

A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months before the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the pastor. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter weekend of the Sponsor Couple Program.

Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

A little girl was sitting on her grandfather's lap and listening to a bedtime story. As she was listening, from time to time, she would touch his wrinkled cheek and then she would feel her own. Finally, she asked, *"Granddaddy, did God make you?" "Yes, my dear",* he said, *"a long time ago."* Then she asked, *"did God make me too?" Yes, my sweetheart,"* he answered, *"just a short time ago."* Feeling his face and hers, she said, *"I think our God is getting better at making people."*

God is always the best in everything He does. He is the Creator of all things, and He saw that everything He made was good. He loves us so much that He made us in His own image and likeness, the most wonderful creation of all. But we sinned against Him and ruined ourselves and the world. Yet He never gave up on us. He keeps calling us back to Him like a good shepherd. He tells us to repent and believe in the Gospel, because the Kingdom of God is nearby.

Last weekend, we heard St. John the Baptist proclaim Jesus as the Lamb of God. Today, we witness Jesus starting His public ministry with a call and a challenge: "Repent, and believe in the Gospel, for the Kingdom of God is at hand." He calls us to turn away from the evil deeds that separate us from God, and He challenges us to do the good deeds that reflect God's will. This call and challenge come from God's love and concern for each one of us, which is greater than our love and concern for Him. We have broken our relationship with God through our sins, and thus we have lost His presence in our lives. But Jesus assures us that, by repenting and believing in the Gospel, we can restore our relationship with Him and shine His light in this world through His justice, peace, and love.

Jesus invites us to be the light of the world and to transform all creation with his love. In today's Gospel, we hear how he called Peter, Andrew, James, and John to follow him and become "fishers of men." He wanted them to share his mission of bringing God's kingdom to all people. He wants the same for us today. He calls us by name and invites us to repent and believe in the Gospel. He asks us to change our hearts and minds and to trust in his promises. He challenges us to be his disciples and to spread his message of hope and joy. We have received this call through our baptism, but sometimes we forget or ignore it. That is why Jesus comes to us again and again, saying "Repent, and believe in the Gospel, for the Kingdom of God is at hand." Yes, we need to renew ourselves first before we can renew others. We need to let Jesus transform us with his grace and power. Let us pray to the Lord of the Eucharist to fill us with the grace to turn away from our sins and embrace the Good News, so that we will live a new

life in Christ, to bring new life to others and the world. **God Bless.**
