Sacrament of Baptism

The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is administered upon request. Parents and Godparents must attend class on Baptism in the Catholic Church. Please contact the pastor or the office to set up an appointment for this class at least a month in advance. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic for their child to be baptized in the Catholic Church. Godparents must be at least 16 years of age, and at least one must be a practicing Catholic.

Sacrament of Penance

Sacrament of Penance is administered every Saturday at 4:30pm or by appointment at St. Sebastian Church.

<u>Rite of Christian initiation of adults and children (RCIA):</u> Adults interested in becoming Catholic participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation (RCIA). The Rite of Christian Initiation is a process of initiation into the Catholic Community of Faith. This is for persons who are seeking baptism in the Catholic Church or full communion with the Catholic tradition through the Profession of Faith, reception of Eucharist and Confirmation. If you are interested, please call the office.

Sacrament of Marriage

A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months before the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the pastor. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter weekend of the Sponsor Couple Program.

Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

The Gospel of last weekend reminded us that we are all responsible for each other's happiness and meaningful life by doing the functions of salt and light. To affirm and remind us about this great responsibility Jesus made the categorical statements about you and I: YOU ARE THE SALT OF THE EARTH ... AND YOU ARE THE LIGHT OF THE WORLD. To be a responsible Christian, and to maintain a good relationship with God and others. God gave us the ten commandments to be followed and this is what the first reading reminds us today. The first reading says, God knows every human action and urges His listeners to make the right choice in life with the help of the Commandments. In the Second Reading, St. Paul reminds us that God has many riches for those who love Him and tells us that the rulers of this age failed to recognize God's wisdom in crucified Christ. Yes, there is no doubt that the obedience to the commandments will bring forth abundance of blessings to all of us. However, the commandments did not bring forth abundance of blessings to the people of Jesus's time, because the religious teachers of Jesus' time interpreted God's commandments according to their conveniences, which made their lives more miserable than happy and meaningful. Thus, Jesus comes to us through the Gospel explaining about the true meaning of the commandments and says, "unless your righteousness surpasses that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will not enter the kingdom of God."

Having wisdom is one of the greatest gifts from God. Anyone with wisdom can be faithful to the Commandments and make the right choice in their lives and lead a happy and meaningful life. Today, Jesus tells us that, to enter the Kingdom of God, "our righteousness should surpass that of the scribes and the Pharisees." Jesus is forced to make this remark against scribes and pharisees because, they were the worst hypocrites in Jesus' time. They presented themselves as holy teachers of religion, but they were not. Scribes and Pharisees had knowledge about the Commandments, but they lacked wisdom to interpret them according to the will of God. So, to say, they gave more importance to the letter of the law than the spirit of the law. It is here, we need to remember the teaching of Jesus, "do not think that I have come to abolish the law or the prophets, I have not come to abolish them but to fulfill them."

Jesus talks about anger. This is not the anger we suddenly feel by witnessing something wrong. Even Jesus felt that kind of anger at times. But Jesus is talking about the anger that we refuse to let go off (Mt.5:23-25, Ephesians 4:16). Yes, dear friends, it is easy to hurt the feelings of someone, but it is not easy to heal those hurt feelings. Jesus talks about

adultery. Jesus says that, not only the act of adultery is wrong, but walking around with 'X' rated mind is also wrong. You might have heard the story of a guy who went to confession and had a very hard time remembering his sins. So, the priest was trying to help him to examine his conscious and at one point the priest asked the guy, "Do you entertain impure thoughts?" The guy said, "No, I don't entertain them, but they entertain me." Jesus talks about taking oaths. He says that there should be no need for taking oath if our speech is honest. Thus, Jesus is trying to tell us that, holiness goes beyond external behavior. Holiness must be deep inside of us, it should be part of our lives, not a Saturday evening and Sunday morning costume.

Today, let us ask a question- One day, we are all looking forward to having a place in heaven but, do my life and activities surpass that of the scribes and Pharisees? Someone asked Jesus "which is the greatest commandment of the law?" And Jesus said, *"Love of God and Love of neighbor."* Let us think, again and again, Is my life, driven by this greatest commandment or not? **God Bless!**
