Sacrament of Marriage

A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months before the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the pastor. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter weekend of the Sponsor Couple Program.

Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

As we continue our pilgrimage to Calvary, today we have reached the third Sunday of Lent. We started our pilgrimage by expressing our true repentance by receiving ashes on our forehead with the invitation "Repent and believe in the Gospel." The first Sunday of Lent reminded us that the Son of Man had no exception from temptation, the same way we could be also dragged into temptation, so we must be vigilant and be prepared with the grace of God through fasting and prayer like Jesus. The readings of last Sunday very clearly taught us about the effect of living in the grace of God through the lives of Abraham who faithfully listened, trusted, and gave everything to the Lord and later the same grace acknowledged by St. Paul who said, "If God is for us, who can be against us?" Yes, the last Sunday was so special that God's glory was revealed to three of Jesus' disciples through Jesus' transfiguration, which is the gift of God to each of us at the end of our faithful pilgrimage.

A man was driving without his seatbelt when he was spotted by a cop right behind him. Suddenly, he looked for the belt and put it on, but it was too late, and the red lights began to flash. "You weren't wearing your seatbelt," said the officer. "Yes, I was," said the man, "and if you don't believe me, ask my wife." The officer looked at the woman and asked her. The woman told the officer, "Sir I have been married to this man for forty years, and there's one thing I have learned: Never argue with him when he's drunk! Just give him a ticket for not wearing the seat belt." In today's Gospel, Jesus doesn't bother to argue with the unjust merchants and moneychangers who have converted the Temple of Jerusalem into a noisy "marketplace" and a "hideout of thieves." Instead, He made a whip out of cords and drove them all out of the temple area.

The Jerusalem temple was the symbol of Jewish religion and the only center for Israel's common worship and sacrifices. The Jews believed that the glory of God is fully manifested there in the temple. However, they just ignored the holiness of the temple and made the Holy place into a marketplace. Jesus was really upset with everything that was going around the Jerusalem Temple not only because the merchants encroached the worshiping place of Gentiles, but they were also exploiting the poor people by selling the sacrificial animals and birds for unjust prices and all the more the temple authorities supported all these illegal activities too. Yes, a great social injustice was happening in the name of religion. By chasing all the merchants from the temple, Jesus was questioning the validity of the entire sacrificial system itself and said, "Stop making my Father's house a marketplace.... Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up." By making

this statement, Jesus is trying to replace the Jewish understanding of the temple and make them understand that the temple was no longer important in Jewish life, but God's glory would be manifested, not in a building, but in a Person. Yes, from now on Jesus is the Temple in Whom His followers encounter God. Our Faith is Person-centered, and we are dealing with a relationship. Thus, the cleansing of the Temple by Jesus conveys to us the message that our parish Church should be the source of strength for our spiritual life and the proper place for its public expression.

I Corinthians 6: 19 reminds us that, "do you not know that your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit who is in you, whom you have from God, and you are not your own?" If this must be believed don't, we have a responsibility to glorify God through our thoughts, words, and actions? While we are celebrating this Holy Eucharist, what are we thinking about? How many of us can talk to God from our hearts? Why is it that even when we are in the Church, our priority is misplaced with something else that is worldly? Jesus says to you and me very clearly and strongly; "Take these out of here and stop making my Father's house a marketplace." This is the reason, Jesus says; " You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength" (Mk.12:30) There is no doubt, our heart, soul, mind and body is consecrated and is the dwelling place of Jesus from the time we received the sacrament of Baptism. but how many times have we messed up His dwelling place with all our sins and other priorities of this world? God Bless.
