Dear friends in Jesus Christ.

On Easter Sunday, the mission of Mary Magdalene and the other Mary, who first witnessed the Resurrection of Our Lord was to report to the disciples of Jesus that the Lord is Risen from the dead. This Sunday, the disciples who personally witnessed the Resurrection of the Lord, proclaim to you and I that the Lord is Risen from the dead. The Gospel clearly shows us that the fearful disciples of Jesus became joyful and courageous after experiencing the resurrection of the Lord. This great transformation in the lives of the disciples is a challenge for us today. After celebrating the resurrection of the Lord on last Sunday, am I a fearful Christian or a joyful Christian? If you are fearful, please do not hesitate to throw yourself onto the feet of Jesus like St. Thomas and ask His mercy, because our Lord is merciful and forgiving. If we find ourselves a joyful Christian, there is a mission to be completed, go, and proclaim that our Lord is Risen and live accordingly.

The disciples of Jesus always had different opinions. They did not have a prepared heart to understand the real meaning of the word of God. Totally they failed to understand who Jesus was while He was with them. So, to say, even though they spent three years with Jesus, they did not have enough faith in Him or in His words. The Gospel of today says to us that, the death of Jesus left the disciples like sheep without a shepherd and so we have a lonely St. Thomas in today's Gospel.

After witnessing the cruel death of Jesus, we see the disciples are locked up in a room by themselves for the fear of Jews. The absence of Jesus makes them scared of everything outside. But the God who promised us 365 times "Do not worry" through the Bible, comes to their rescue by promising them Peace through the Holy Spirit and strengthens them. Dear friends, be mindful of this truth that fear is the product of evil and Peace is the product of the Holy Spirit. So, let us examine, what kind of spirit is dwelling in us? The same God, who kicked out fear from the hearts of the disciples, is ready to rescue you and I, provided we open our hearts and accept Him as our Boss. The book of Revelation 3:20 says, "Behold, I stand at the door, and knock, if anyone hears my voice, and open the door, I will come into him, and will dwell with Him and he with Me."

This Sunday we celebrate the Feast of Divine Mercy and the Feast of Reconciliation too. As Christians, these two feasts are very important to our spiritual journey because our whole existence is in the Mercy of God. At the same time these two feasts are interrelated, because it is through the Sacrament of Reconciliation, we believe to receive the Mercy of

of God for our failures. In today's Gospel we see St. Thomas is pleading for the Mercy of God for his unbelief in the Resurrection of our Lord, by falling onto the feet of Jesus and confirming his faith in Him; "My Lord and my God". We understand from the Gospel that the main reason for the fear of the disciples and the unbelief of St. Thomas is caused by the absence of Jesus. The same way, ignoring the presence of Jesus in our lives can invite many problems and troubles in our lives too.

The disciples who are not familiar with the absence of Jesus in their lives are called to accept a new method of following Jesus; "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and believed." It is an invitation to believe in Jesus through with the help of the Holy Spirit which we read in the Gospel of John 16:7, "I tell you the truth: it is to your advantage that I go away, for if I do not go away, the Helper will not come to you. But if I go, I will send him to you." Dear friends, during this Mass, let us confess our faith in Jesus by falling onto His feet seeking His Mercy like St. Thomas and ask the Lord to Breath His spirit upon each one of us, so that we will proclaim to the world that the Lord is truly Risen. Alleluia! Alleluia!
