At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic for their child to be baptized in the Catholic Church. Godparents must be at least 16 years of age, and at least one must be a practicing Catholic.

Sacrament of Penance is administered every Saturday at 3:00 pm or by appointment at St. Sebastian Church.

Rite of Christian initiation of adults and children (RCIA):

Adults interested in becoming Catholic participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation (RCIA). The Rite of Christian Initiation is a process of initiation into the Catholic Community of Faith. This is for persons who are seeking baptism in the Catholic Church or full communion with the Catholic tradition through the Profession of Faith, reception of Eucharist and Confirmation. If you are interested, please call the office.

Sacrament of Marriage

A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months before the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the pastor. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter weekend of the Sponsor Couple Program.

Dear friends in Jesus Christ.

After having taught us about the importance of having the wisdom of God in our lives to lead a better Christian life through the scripture readings of last weekend, the Gospel of today teaches us about how well we should use the wisdom of God, so that we may be able to please God and enjoy His reward in our lives.

Once a woman after a long search for a parking space parked the car in a no-parking space. Hurriedly she put a note under the windshield wiper it read; "I have circled this block for twenty-five minutes and could not find a space. I have an important and urgent appointment and if I don't do this, I will lose my job. I am sorry, forgive my trespass." When she noticed that there was no objection to her parking and quickly, she drove away. At the corner, however, the traffic officer stopped her car. The officer taking off his cap wished her a good day and gave her a paper with a note; "I have circled this block twenty-five times, and if I don't do this, I will lose my job. I am sorry too. Lead us not into temptation." Pinned neatly to this little note was a ticket.

The Gospel of today, reminds us about the need to be responsible and faithful children of God to succeed in our lives. The entire Bible speaks about the wisdom that each of us should accept in different occasions of our lives to succeed even during troubles. But very often most of us hear only what we want to hear in the Gospel. We enjoy hearing about God's mercy and love and tend to ignore the places and sayings where Jesus tells us about our responsibilities to be done. The parable of today very clearly gives us the message that Heaven is not an easy place to enter and is not automatic. Without doubt we all need the sanctifying grace of God to enter heaven and unquestionably everyone is gifted with the grace of God, but the guestion is how many of us make use of this grace of God responsibly? Often, we make complaints about the things we do not have in our lives rather than thanking the Lord for the things that we have. This negative attitude is the worst tragedy of our lives and the biggest crime that we do to the grace of God. This is the same Jesus saying in Mathew 13:12 "To the man who has will be given more and they will have in abundance. Whoever does not have even what they have will be taken from them."

The Gospel also acknowledges the greatest truth of God's creation that everyone is unique and special, and that is why the Gospel mentions that "the man gave talents to each according to his ability." The same way, we have received grace and talents from God according to each one's ability, and so the challenge before us is- to be an individual in the

given situation with the given talents and be successful. Yes, "winners don't do different things, they do things differently."

Now, as Christians, how can we become responsible, faithful, and successful Christians with the gifts and talents we have in our hands? The easiest way is to use all our talents for the glory of God. The greatest gift and talent that God has given us is the presence of Christ within us and His word. However, as Christians how much effort do we make to grow in His love and peace. and share that love and peace with others? This is the primary responsibility of every Christian. If we look around the world, undoubtedly, we can often say most of us are very passive in doing our primary responsibility as Christians, and as a result we do partake in building a broken world instead of the Kingdom of God. Remember, we are named after Christ and so we are Christians. As Christians we have the most beautiful and powerful talent in our hands-Christ Himself. Do not be like the lazy servant in the Gospel. The Gospel reminds us that "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few." So, wake up, be prepared, and work hard, for the kingdom of God is at hand. God Bless.
