Dear friends in Jesus Christ,

As a believer, we all believe that Jesus will never desert anyone or disappoint anyone who approaches Him with true Faith, because it is His nature to Love and care for every one without any discrimination. In today's Gospel we see the young rich man comes to Jesus and goes back with a great disappointment. I am sure, if we were to be in his place, we also would have the same disappointment.

The young rich man comes to Jesus and asks an important question in everyone's life- "Good teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life". The young rich man had everything in his life, but never has been satisfied. He had everything of this world, but nothing of God's world. The question from the young man appears to be very sincere, but his reaction of disappointment after Jesus' reply, gives us the message that the young rich man was not sincere. but rather He was trying to pretend himself to be good before Jesus. If we make a serious examination of conscious, on and off we are also behaving like the young rich man-standing before the Lord as the most sincere person, when we are at different sacraments. But are we really sincere in our dealings with God?

Yes, the young man thought just following the commandments would secure him eternal life, but Jesus spoiled his entire mood when he heard, "Go, *sell, what you have and give to the poor and you will have treasures in heaven, then come, follow me.*" The disappointment of the young man was due to his ignorance of the commandments-he was more concerned about the letters of the law, than the spirit of the law. Yes, it is the same mistake we all make in our lives too. So for a better understanding of the laws, it is always good to have a spiritual guidance and as a Christian, the best guide should be Jesus Himself. Yes, let us pray for His continued guidance in our lives, otherwise our lives will be a disappointing one.

There are mainly five things that Jesus is telling the young man to do; Go, Sell, Give to the poor, come, and follow me. By advising the young man to follow these five steps, Jesus makes it clear that, there is no short cut to eternity other than complete TRUST in the Lord. The five steps proposed by Jesus to the rich man is applicable to each one of us too, if we are planning for eternity. This is the reason in the Gospel of Mark 12:41ff, Jesus appreciates the offerings of the poor widow. So the Gospel invites each one us to become a different person with a complete Trust and Faith in God. Because once we experience the Love of God, we will surely find that all that we have in this world is useless. So, Jesus says to us again, "Go, sell what you have and give to the poor and you will

have treasures in heave;, then come, follow me." May the Good Lord Bless you.
