The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter weekend of the Sponsor Couple Program.



Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,


Yes, even though, the Gospel was written thousands of years back, the question raised in today's Gospel by Peter is highly important in today's world, if we take the question seriously-how often must I forgive? According to the Jewish law, a person could be forgiven 3 times. But Peter goes beyond the law of the time, trying to play a "good boy" game before the other disciples and his Master, he increases the amount of forgiveness to number seven, the number of perfection or completeness, then asks; "as many as seven times? But the master who understood the inner thoughts of Peter spoils his "good boy" game by saying "not seven times, but seventy-seven times." By saving this Jesus very clearly says to us that, forgiveness has no limit at all or don't put any limit to forgiveness. Yes, forgiveness is not a matter of a number, but it is a matter of love.

To establish the point, that forgiveness is the matter of love, Jesus presents to us the story of the court official who owed the king a huge amount of debt, which he could not repay in due time. The king, however, was so kind and merciful that he cancelled the debt completely. Yet, the official in his turn was not even ready to forgive a colleague who owed him a much smaller amount. Finding the unforgiving attitude of the official, the king got angry and put the official in prison until he paid back the whole debt.

The lesson we are called upon to take from this Gospel is to be generous and large-hearted in forgiving others. This is the same, we are seeking in the Lord's Prayer; "forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us." Today, if we find it difficult to forgive others, the reason is not the other person, but ourselves. Because to forgive others, it is important that we forgive ourselves, because only then can we forgive others, and thereby forgiveness from God. Yes, forgiveness needs an openness of heart. If we hold mercury tightly in our hand, it will run away from our hand; only in the open palm we can hold mercury. The same way, only in the openness of heart is forgiveness possible. If we lose forgiveness from our life, we can lose forgiveness of our sins and ability to give and receive love.

Forgiveness needs true love and sacrifice. Please remember the homily I started with on last weekend; our Christian life is to live, to live is to love and to love is to sacrifice. Remember, the forgiveness we all received from Jesus even during heart-breaking pain on the cross, and the sacrifice Jesus endured for all of us to reconcile us to His Heavenly Father! Count the forgiveness we continue to receive in our everyday life from the Lord, even though we are

unworthy, and so we are here today! Yes, if we really appreciate the goodness of the Lord in our lives, we cannot be unforgiving, but only forgiving. Yes, dear friends, the Gospel says to us that, as a Christian it is our duty to give forgiveness, and at the same time it is the right of the other persons to receive forgiveness from us. So, let us ask the Eucharistic Lord to bless us with the grace to forgive and to forget the wrongs others have done us. **God Bless.**



The Angel's Prayer at Fatima

During the third apparition of the Angel of Peace to the 3 Shepherd Children (Lucia, Francisco and Jacinta) at Fatima in 1916, the angel appeared holding in his left hand a chalice and over it, in the air, was a host from which drops of blood fell into the chalice. With the Blessed Sacrament suspended in the air, the Angel of Peace prostrated himself on the ground and recited this prayer three times. After giving the host to Lucia and the contents of the chalice to Jacinta & Francisco, he prostrated himself again on the ground and again repeated with the children 3 times the following prayer. Most Holy Trinity, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, I adore You profoundly, and I offer You the Most Precious Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ, present in all the tabernacles of the world, in reparation for the outrages, sacrileges and indifferences by which He is offended. And by the infinite merits of His Most Sacred Heart and through the Immaculate Heart of Mary, I
