Please contact the pastor or the office to set up an appointment for this class at least a month in advance. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic for their child to be baptized in the Catholic Church. Godparents must be at least 16 years of age, and at least one must be a practicing Catholic.</p> <p><b>Is anyone sick/admitted in the hospital?</b> If anyone is sick or admitted in the hospital, please let Pastor know or call the office.</p> <p><b>Sacrament of Penance</b> Sacrament of Penance is administered every Saturday at 4:30pm or by appointment at St. Sebastian Church.</p>	<p><b>Rite of Christian initiation of adults and children (RCIA):</b> Adults interested in becoming Catholic participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation (RCIA). The Rite of Christian Initiation is a process of initiation into the Catholic Community of Faith. This is for persons who are seeking baptism in the Catholic Church or full communion with the Catholic tradition through the Profession of Faith, reception of Eucharist and Confirmation. If you are interested, please call the office.</p> <p><b>Sacrament of Marriage</b> A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months before the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the pastor. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter weekend of the Sponsor Couple Program.</p>

**Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,**

The Gospel of last weekend reminded us to prepare ourselves through our true repentance to welcome Jesus into our hearts and in our lives. Today, we celebrate the fruit of our true repentance, accepting Jesus as the King of our lives. With this great celebration, we come to the end of liturgical year C. Those who did not respond to the invitation from the Gospel of last weekend, the new liturgical year starts with a new season of Advent calling us again for true repentance in preparation for the celebration of Christmas, where everyone is invited to welcome the Child Jesus into their hearts and lives. Whether the liturgical year is A or B or C, the common theme of the Gospel mission is to become like Jesus Christ through our true repentance, because the mission of the statement of Jesus is to, "Repent and Believe in the Gospel, for the Kingdom of God is at hand."

Every day or at least every Sunday we pray together the beautiful prayer of Our Father, and knowingly or unknowingly we all pray "thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven." After having killed and crucified Jesus, we are asking Him again to establish His kingdom here on earth and be our King! Trusting in each one of us only, Jesus willingly suffered and died for us. Today, we live in a modern world where most people like to follow St. Thomas at times, who said; "Unless I see the nail marks in his hands and put my finger where the nails were, and put my hand into his side, I will not believe." The same way, it is not enough that we say, I love Jesus and celebrate Mass or attend Mass every day or every Sunday, rather our love and the graces we receive through the sacraments needs to be seen through our lives in this world. Jesus says He loves us, and He has five holy wounds on His body to prove His love for us. When we say we love Jesus, what is the proof we have in our lives to show to Jesus and to this world? Often, we fail to create a space for Jesus in this world through our lives and that is the reason

Jesus says, "I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing." (Lk 12:49)

From the scripture we see that by seeing the extra ordinary ministry of Jesus many people wanted to make Jesus a king, but Jesus always slipped away from them. Again, it is at Jesus' crucifixion we see an inscription on His cross that read, "This is the King of the Jews." Though, the inscription is put on the cross to mock Jesus and all that He has done for the people of God ("If you are King of the Jews, save yourself") the resurrection of Jesus proved that He is the real King. We all have become part of Jesus' Passion, Death, and Resurrection through the sacrament of Baptism, but how many of us or do we have a strong faith to journey through Jesus' Passion, Death, and Resurrection? It is possible for all of us provided we accept Jesus as the king of our lives. Whenever we fail to accept and live like Jesus, surely, we go along with the soldiers who mocked Him, and we continue to mock Jesus Passion, Death, and Resurrection through our sins. So, at least as Catholics and Christians, let us value our Jesus' Passion, Death, and Resurrection though our true repentance and thus establish His Kingdom here on earth and thus let us pray; "thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven." **God Bless.**
