

Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

Last weekend through the Gospel, Jesus was inviting us to look for the treasure called the Kingdom of God, rather than many other things of this world. In connection with the treasure hunting, we were also reminded of the promise of Jesus through the Gospel of Mathew that, "Seek first the Kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things will be added unto you." And today's Gospel is a clear example of the fulfillment of Jesus' promise. Yes, mere five loaves and two fishes are going through a great transformation in the hands of Jesus Christ; so, the Gospel of today is a wakeup call for anyone who says that they do not have much to offer or give. This is what Jesus says to us again and again "Seek first the Kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things will be added unto you." In today's world, every one of us is called to take the role of Jesus in today's Gospel, which is the perfect evangelization; meet the spiritual and physical needs of our brother and sisters.

Today, from different parts of the world, we hear a lot about people who are starving and dying. By reading all this horrifying news we express our sympathy and make many comments on social media, but do you think comments will help the needy and the poor? Today, Jesus is telling us to find solution for the problem and he says, "Give them some food yourselves." To the command of Jesus, the disciples say- "we do not have much; we have only five loaves and two fish." Yes, often is it not the same excuse we also make, I do not have much, I am poor etc., whenever we are asked to give some charity or asked

to give a little more money to the church or any other noble cause? Dear friends, Jesus is not asking how much you have, but He is telling "Bring them here to me what you have." Yes, the disciples gave what they had to Jesus and there comes the powerful miracle.

Dear friends, instead of grumbling about what we do not have, Jesus invites us to offer to Him what we have and what we are. In the Gospel we see only when it is given to Jesus, He blessed and satisfied the whole crowd. In the same way, when we give what we have to the Lord, for His glory with a grateful heart, He will bless us abundantly and will satisfy us too. Guidelines for Resuming Parish Gatherings

Outside the Liturgy

Effective immediately (July 1, 2020), parish gatherings outside the liturgy (parish picnics, faith formation gatherings, RCIA meetings, etc.) as well as non-parish sponsored events held by groups renting or using parish facilities or property.

- Limit the persons in attendance to no more than 50% of the maximum permitted occupancy capacity of the space.
- Maintain physical distance of six feet minimum from those not living within the same household.
- Wear face covering over mouth and nose. Based on CDC recommendations, everyone over the age of two must wear a mask for the duration of any event held on parish property if closer than six feet to anyone not living within the same household. Those unable to wear a face mask at the event, whether it be due to age, health condition, or preference, are asked to stay healthy at home.
- Conduct temperature and health checks for each participant.
- Ensure proper, frequent cleaning and sanitation of the gathering space, including restrooms.
- Encourage those at high risk to stay Healthy at Home.
