Sacrament of Baptism

The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is administered upon request. Parents and Godparents must attend class on Baptism in the Catholic Church. Please contact the pastor or the office to set up an appointment for this class at least a month in advance. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic for their child to be baptized in the Catholic Church. Godparents must be at least 16 years of age, and at least one must be a practicing Catholic.

Sacrament of Penance

Sacrament of Penance is administered every Saturday at 4:30pm or by appointment at St. Sebastian Church.

<u>Rite of Christian initiation of adults and children (RCIA):</u> Adults interested in becoming Catholic participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation (RCIA). The Rite of Christian Initiation is a process of initiation into the Catholic Community of Faith. This is for persons who are seeking baptism in the Catholic Church or full communion with the Catholic tradition through the Profession of Faith, reception of Eucharist and Confirmation. If you are interested, please call the office.

Sacrament of Marriage

A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months before the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the pastor. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter weekend of the Sponsor Couple Program.

Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

Through the Gospel of last weekend, Jesus came to us and reminded us that He is the Good Shepherd who lays down his life for his sheep. There are many who have neglected these words of Jesus from this past weekend's Gospel, and wandering in this world. looking for peace, joy and meaning in life. Jesus says, "I have other sheep that are not of this fold. I must bring them in as well, and they will listen to My voice. Then there will be one flock and one shepherd." (Jn 10:16) To get those troubled children of God to His sheepfold, Jesus comes again through the Gospel of today with another promising message, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one can come to the Father except through me." As we listen to this Jesus today, let us ask ourselves, do I still neglect the words of Jesus and hesitant to enter His sheepfold? If so, how long will we close our ears and hearts against Him?

In the first reading we see the early Christian community expanding its leadership by selecting seven reputable men filled with wisdom and the Holy Spirit are prayed over by the apostles through the imposition of hands for a special Church ministry. Thus, these chosen Christian disciples by being faithful to Christ and receptive to the promptings of the Holy Spirt engaged themselves in the spreading of the Word of God. Through the second reading St. Peter encourages us to be aware of our responsibility as 'living stones,' with Christ as the cornerstone, to form a 'spiritual building.' St. Peter also reminds us of our dignity as, "a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people of his own" to sing his praises. Thus, by serving God and by doing justice to our spiritual identity, we can reach our final destiny, which is possible through Jesus Christ, who reminds us through the Gospel that, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one can come to the Father except through me."

The Gospel of today is the farewell discourse of Jesus at the Last Supper and addresses concerns of the disciples and Jesus' response to their concerns and worries. The Gospel of today invites us to reflect on the coming departure of Jesus in the Ascension and the impact on us believers of the physical absence of Jesus. The disciples of Jesus are aware that Jesus is about to leave them. There is so much anxiety and worry among the disciples due to the fear of Jews. "Do not let your hearts be troubled," is the encouraging words he speaks to them. "Trust in God still, and trust in me" is a call to total faith in the Father and in Him. Trusting in God means accepting and facing reality. It means dealing with our problems knowing that even in worst-case scenarios, God will not allow us to be crushed and lost. We do our best and God will take care of the rest. The passage also

also assures them that Jesus will return and take his followers with him. The immanent departure of Jesus is presented not as a loss but as a preparation for the future. And this preparation can be successful only by following the words of Jesus, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one can come to the Father except through me." Yes, Jesus is the road to walk, His truth is our support during our journey and the Eternal life that He promises is our reward. In short, we are to live like Jesus in this world and bless this world through our presence. Thus, by living like Jesus, we live for God and see Him face to face. Let us be reminded of our identity as a Christians as Peter said, "a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people of his own." Let us take up this mission and pass on this mission to our next generation too. God Bless.
