At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic for their child to be baptized in the Catholic Church. Godparents must be at least 16 years of age, and at least one must be a practicing Catholic.

Adults interested in becoming Catholic participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation (RCIA). The Rite of Christian Initiation is a process of initiation into the Catholic Community of Faith. This is for persons who are seeking baptism in the Catholic Church or full communion with the Catholic tradition through the Profession of Faith, reception of Eucharist and Confirmation. If you are interested, please call the office.

Sacrament of Marriage

A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months before the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the pastor. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter weekend of the Sponsor Couple Program.

Dear Friends in Jesus Christ.

Once a philosopher was walking along a seashore reflecting, and trying to find out an answer to the question - "How am I to achieve happiness?" Then suddenly, he noticed that a little away from the seashore, a poor fisherman was lying on a mat resting under a tree, outside of his small house. The Philosopher went to the fisherman and said, "You shouldn't be wasting your time like that." "What should I do then?" asked the fisherman. "You should be out fishing, that way you will get more fish and by selling them you will have more money," the Philosopher told him. "What should I do then?" again asked the fisherman. The Philosopher told him, "If you keep doing so, one day you will have enough money to buy a bigger boat and you will be able to go into the deeper sea and catch bigger fish and by selling them you will make still more money." "What should I do after that?" asked again the fisherman. The Philosopher answered him, "Then you should buy more boats, hire men to help you and make fishing a big business. This will make you plenty of money." "What should I do then?" asked the fisherman again. The philosopher then said, "When you have plenty of money, you should go and buy a big mansion, marry a beautiful woman, have children and enjoy your life." "What should I do then?" the fisherman further asked. Immediately, the philosopher said, "Oh! Then you go, lie down, relax, and be happy." At this the fisherman smiled and said to the philosopher, "And what do you think that I am doing now?!"

Everyone wants to be happy. God too wants all his children to be happy. So, the question is not in happiness, rather - how to achieve happiness. The readings of today speak about how to achieve true and lasting happiness which comes from God. In the First Reading, the Prophet Zephaniah says that those who seek God with lowliness and humility, and serve God and obey His commands, they will find the peace and happiness they desire. In the Second Reading, St. Paul asks the Corinthians to consider their calling and make the contrast between the values of Jesus and the values of the world. When we come to the Gospel reading, we have 'the Beatitudes' or the Sermon on the Mount according to Mathew. In them Jesus gives His prescription for true and lasting happiness.

In the Old Testament we see that, to direct the lives of the people of Israel according to the will of God and help them to experience true happiness, God calls Moses to Mount Sinai and gave him Ten commandments for the people to follow. When we come to the New Testament, to ensure our true happiness Jesus announces His beatitudes for each one of us to live by. If we closely examine the Old

Testament as well as the New Testament, we find that the sufferings of people are not caused by God, but by the human attitude & intervention. Yes, it is due to our lack of respect for our fellow brethren that we have sufferings in this world. It is because of our failure to love God and our neighbor sincerely, we have sufferings in this world, and today's Gospel very clearly reveals this truth to us too. However, the good part of the Gospel is that, though all the sufferings are caused by human beings, God transforms those problems into great Blessings to enter heaven. Dear friends, today's Gospel can be disappointing, if you follow the values of this world, but this Gospel can fill our hearts with great hope and happiness if we follow God and His values in our lives. So be sure, it is the attitude that makes the difference in our lives. As Christians, the challenge for us is to make the Beatitudes as our attitude, and it is to attain this great attitude only Jesus came to us last weekend calling out to us; "Repent and believe in the Gospel for the kingdom of heaven is at hand," so that we can live our present lives pleasing to God, filled with Faith, Hope and Love. 
