Today, we live in a world where everyone is looking for an instant result for anything that they do, but today Jesus is asking us to slow down. We sometimes feel that our little bit will make no difference, but remember that "little drops make the mighty ocean." In this regard, St. Theresa of Calcutta says, "Not all of us can do great things. But we can do small things with great love."

In the second parable of the mustard seed Jesus says, the little seed grows to become a big plant with large branches welcomes all kinds of birds to dwell and enjoy the shade. This little parable is asking us to reflect about growth of our own spiritual life. Dear friends, daily and weekend masses are very important for the growth of our spiritual life, at the same time it is also important how we relate with others with kindness and love. This is the reason Jesus always stresses the point of "Love of God and Love of neighbor." Just as a tall big tree has deeper roots with large branches which welcomes all kinds

of birds and gives shade, only parents with deep rooted faith in Jesus Christ can build a holy family, strong community and become an example to others through their love and care to everyone without any kind of discrimination.

Is there anyone who has grown by himself or herself? All of us live here in this world with the help of someone else. The same way, God needs our help for the growth of the Kingdom of God here on earth. Can you be a help for Jesus to build the kingdom of God is the question of the Gospel today. Dear friends, the seed of the kingdom of God fell on many people, but the fate of all seeds were not the same. Some fell on the path, some fell on the rocky ground, and some fell among the bushes.
