<p><u>Sacrament of Baptism</u> The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is administered upon request. Parents and Godparents must attend class on Baptism in the Catholic Church. Please contact the pastor or the office to set up an appointment for this class at least a month in advance. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic for their child to be baptized in the Catholic Church. Godparents must be at least 16 years of age, and at least one must be a practicing Catholic.</p> <p><u>Is anyone sick/admitted in the hospital?</u> If anyone is sick or admitted in the hospital, please let Pastor know or call the office.</p> <p><u>Sacrament of Penance</u> Sacrament of Penance is administered every Saturday at 4:30pm or by appointment at St. Sebastian Church.</p>	<p><u>Rite of Christian initiation of adults and children (RCIA):</u> Adults interested in becoming Catholic participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation (RCIA). The Rite of Christian Initiation is a process of initiation into the Catholic Community of Faith. This is for persons who are seeking baptism in the Catholic Church or full communion with the Catholic tradition through the Profession of Faith, reception of Eucharist and Confirmation. If you are interested, please call the office.</p> <p><u>Sacrament of Marriage</u> A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months before the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the pastor. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter weekend of the Sponsor Couple Program.</p>

Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

After the attack on the World Trade Center in New York, Churches all over the United States were fully packed for a couple of weeks, because this incident disturbed their concept of safety in this world. A great fear crept into their hearts. But the attack did not have a lasting effect on the religiosity of the people. After few weeks people went back to normal, and the Church attendance began to fall again. We know that, after the 9/11 attack many unfortunate things have happened in and around the world until now, but nothing seems to be affecting many of us. How long will we continue to live like this in this world, especially as Catholic or as a Christian? The Book of Revelation 3: 15-17 says to us; *“I know your works; I know that you are neither cold nor hot. I wish you were either cold or hot. So, because you are lukewarm, neither hot nor cold, I will spit you out of my mouth. For you say, ‘I am rich and affluent and have no need of anything,’ and yet do not realize that you are wretched, pitiable, poor, blind and naked.”*

It is easy to live in this world, but it is not that easy to live in this world following Christ intimately. As we are getting closer to the end of the liturgical year C, the Gospel of today comes to us with a prophetic preaching from Jesus about the end of this world and the beginning of a new world, where Christ is the ruler and the King. Thus, today’s Gospel is an invitation to all of us to prepare spiritually for the celebration of Christ the King and accept Jesus as the ruler of our lives through our true repentance, not like the repentance after the 9/11 attack which lasted only for a few weeks.

To most Jews, the Jerusalem Temple was the soul of their faith. It was the heart and pride of all Jewish life because of its beautiful structure, and it was the symbol of God’s presence among them. They thought that their temple would last forever. But Jesus warns them that this great structure would not last forever. Jesus says, *“the days will come when there will not be left a stone upon another stone that will not be thrown down.”* This saying of Jesus disturbed their faith. Jesus made this prophesy, because by giving so much importance to the structure and the beauty of the Jerusalem temple, they were going against the will of God and breaking the first commandment; *“I am the Lord your God, you shall not have no other gods before me.”* Yes, they glorified the beauty of the Jerusalem temple, neglecting to glorify the blessings God has given to them.

Dear friends, Jesus’ warning to the Jews in today’s Gospel is a warning to each of us too. Listening to the warning of Jesus, we are called to determine the

the core of our faith-Is our life centered around Jesus Christ or something else? A couple of times, I have asked some people about their absence in the Church, and they replied, *“we had lots of other things going on.”* People, those who give more importance to other things than Christ, may not be able to keep their faith when many unfortunate things like false prophets, war, earthquake, famine, plagues etc. happen in their lives. Be sure, if you cannot find time for God, God will get you into a situation where you will have plenty of time for God, because Jesus who came to do the will of His Father says; *“And this is the will of the one who sent me, that I should not lose anything of what he gave me.”* So, it is better to turn back to God and give due time and glory to God from now on.

Often, we say, “Blood is thicker than the water.” Can you imagine the amount of time we spend for our family members, relatives, friends, etc.? Sometimes, we don’t even mind skipping Sunday Masses for our dear ones. But today, Jesus is warning us *“...they will put some of you to death and you will be hated because of my name”*. By saying this, Jesus reminds us that the spiritual relationship is greater than blood relations. This is the reason Jesus says, *“for whoever does the will of my Father in heaven is my brother and sister and mother.”*

Dear friends, following Christ is not just a way of life but rather it is a way of living the life of Christ in this world. Today, Jesus is calling us to take this challenge sincerely, and in return He assures His special protection for all of us even during all the troubled situations, for He says, *“not a hair on your head will be destroyed without my knowledge”*. Are you ready to accept Jesus as the King and celebrate and live His Kingship in your life?

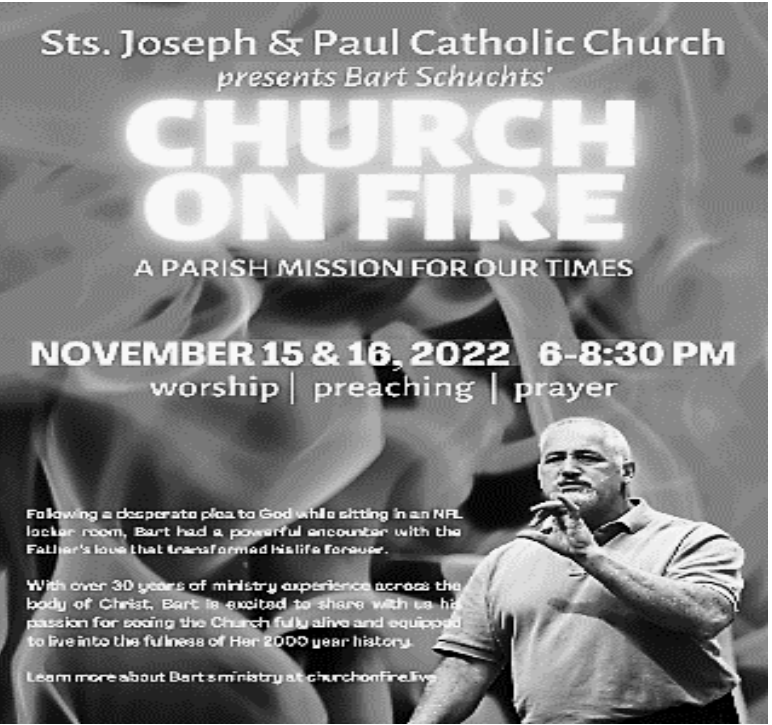
