Sacrament of Baptism

The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is administered upon request. Parents and Godparents must attend class on Baptism in the Catholic Church. Please contact the pastor or the office to set up an appointment for this class at least a month in advance. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic for their child to be baptized in the Catholic Church. Godparents must be at least 16 years of age, and at least one must be a practicing Catholic.

Is anyone sick/admitted in the hospital?

If anyone is sick or admitted in the hospital, please let Pastor know or call the office.

Sacrament of Penance

Sacrament of Penance is administered every Saturday at 3:00 pm or by appointment at St. Sebastian Church.

Rite of Christian initiation of adults and children (RCIA):

Adults interested in becoming Catholic participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation (RCIA). The Rite of Christian Initiation is a process of initiation into the Catholic Community of Faith. This is for persons who are seeking baptism in the Catholic Church or full communion with the Catholic tradition through the Profession of Faith, reception of Eucharist and Confirmation. If you are interested, please call the office.

Sacrament of Marriage

A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months before the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the pastor. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter weekend of the Sponsor Couple Program.

Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

There was a lady who claimed that Jesus was appearing to her. She told her Bishop about it. The bishop was very skeptical about it and told her that he wanted some solid proof that it was happening. So, he told her that, the next time Jesus is appearing to you, you should ask Jesus-what the bishop confessed the last time when he went to confession, and it should be reported to the bishop personally. Did she ask Jesus about the bishop's confession? Yes, the woman did ask. With much curiosity, the bishop asked her about her vision and the proof that he requested to ask. The woman said, yes, I asked Jesus about your confession, but Jesus said He just forgot that day itself. Yes, it was a genuine vision of the lady, or the lady was a smart cookie because that is the way it is with God: when we repent and change our hearts, God forgets our past. Yes, it brings healing and peace to know that we can still change, and God gives us a chance to start over.

By presenting this parable Jesus gives us an open invitation to change our hearts and turn to Him. Jesus makes it clear that good intentions are not enough, and promises don't count unless they are performed. In the Gospel Jesus is stressing on the conversion of our heart. This is the same God who speaks to us through the mouth of the Prophet Joel 2:13, "Rend your hearts and not your garments." The Gospel is inviting us for a serious examination of consciouswhere are we standing in our relationship with God. Drawing inspiration from the Gospel of today, we all know that since from the beginning of our Christian life we are engaged in making a series of promises to God, but how faithful are we to the promises we made? By receiving the sacrament of Baptism, we promise that we will reject Satan, his works, his promises etc., but.... By entering in to the sacrament of marriage both parties promise to God that from this day forward, for better, for worse, for richer, for poorer, in sickness and in health, until death do us part., but.....By entering into the sacrament of Priesthood, a deacon promises to God before the Bishop that, till his death he will be faithful to God, obedient to the Church and her teachings and obedient to his superiors, but.....Yes, by receiving every sacrament we are making promises after promises to God, but in reality often we are far from materializing our promises.

Yes, most of us are making every effort possible to be good and best by participating in the celebrations of sacraments and sacramentals and doing many other charities. But today's Gospel ends with a shocking statement from Jesus; "Amen, I say to you, tax collectors and prostitutes are entering the *kingdom of God before you.*" Does this statement not

shock you? If we examine, we will see that in one way or another, each one of us are representing either of the sons in the Gospel. The Yes-people were the pharisees, scribes and those who kept the law. They had listened to John the Baptist and pretend to be the best religious people, but when it came to the point of committing themselves to God's message they were nowhere on the scene. This is the reason Jesus preferred tax collectors and sinners. They were the Nopeople at first by their lives. But later, they changed since they were open to the truth and gave full commitments to the kingdom of God and its values. So, let us not underestimate the so-called No-people of society. Let us give them a little more recognition and appreciation because Jesus came for those people especially. In the gospel of Luke 5:32 Jesus says, "I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners, to repentance." So, today could be the last day for you and I to repent and to believe in the Gospel. Thus, through the book of Prophet Isaiah 1:18 the Lord is giving us a call, "Come now, let's settle this, though your sins are like scarlet, I will make them as white as snow. Though they are red like crimson, I will make them as white as wool." God Bless.
