Please contact the pastor or the office to set up an appointment for this class at least a month in advance. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic for their child to be baptized in the Catholic Church. Godparents must be at least 16 years of age, and at least one must be a practicing Catholic.

Sacrament of Penance is administered every Saturday at 3:00 pm or by appointment at St. Sebastian Church.

Rite of Christian initiation of adults and children (RCIA):

Adults interested in becoming Catholic participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation (RCIA). The Rite of Christian Initiation is a process of initiation into the Catholic Community of Faith. This is for persons who are seeking baptism in the Catholic Church or full communion with the Catholic tradition through the Profession of Faith, reception of Eucharist and Confirmation. If you are interested, please call the office.

Sacrament of Marriage

A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months before the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the pastor. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter weekend of the Sponsor Couple Program.

Dear friends in Jesus Christ,

When a woman teacher became engaged, one of her more experienced co-workers decided to give her some good advice. "Just remember, she said, the first ten years of marriage are the hardest." The younger teacher asked her co-worker how long she had been married. "Ten years," she answered. As human beings every one of us will have some complaints about others and no doubt all the complaints are the results of broken love. Today, Jesus directs our attention to the most important commandment of all time; "You shall love the Lord. your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind and you shall love your neighbor as yourself." As we sincerely reflect about this greatest commandment, there is no doubt that most of us have broken both relationships-relationship with God and with neighbor. Therefore, we have complaint after complaint instead of compliments.

Once a king decided to know the wellbeing of his people personally. So, he put on a different costume, and nobody could identify him as he went to different streets socializing with people. About noon, as he was walking on the street, he noticed an old man planting apple trees on both sides of the street. The king went to this old man and asked him, "What are you doing in this scorching sun?" The old man replied, "I am planting some apple trees." The king asked- "Do you ever think, you will be able to eat an apple from one of these trees before you die?" The old man looked at the king with a smile and replied "the fruits that I eat today are not the fruits of my labor, but of my parents and grandparents. Now I do this for the next generation, for their wellbeing." The king was so happy hearing this answer that he invited the old man to his palace and presented him with a box full of gold coins.

When it comes to the issue of love, everyone thinks and talks about what others have not done for me. Have you every thought, if Jesus were to adopt this same attitude towards each of us, what will be the situation? The Gospel of today teaches that instead of asking for love from someone, the act of love should begin from oneself and that is why Jesus says, "love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind and you shall love your neighbor as yourself". Yes, a dedicated effort is demanded from each one of us in the act of love. With all your heart-this means with whole love. With all your soul-this means with whole life in its fullness. With all your mind-this means with all that we have. Yes, the entire life should be dedicated to love and that is Jesus. This is the greatest testimony the Bible states about Jesus in Acts 10:38, "He went about doing good." Yes, Jesus was the perfect example of perfect love from birth to

death and through resurrection until this moment, and every one of us is invited for this perfect love, and can we do that love in our lives? If Jesus could, we can, because Jesus never demanded anything from His children that He did not do and anything that we cannot do in our lives.

To attain this perfect love in our lives, we need the support of two other Christian virtues in our lives-Faith & Hope, because it is the Faith in God and Hope in His promises that strengthens us in the love of God.
