### Sacrament of Baptism

The Sacrament of Baptism for infants is administered upon request. Parents and Godparents must attend class on Baptism in the Catholic Church. Please contact the pastor or the office to set up an appointment for this class at least a month in advance. At least one parent must be a practicing Catholic for their child to be baptized in the Catholic Church. Godparents must be at least 16 years of age, and at least one must be a practicing Catholic.

### Is anyone sick/admitted in the hospital?

If anyone is sick or admitted in the hospital, please let Pastor know or call the office.

### Sacrament of Penance

Sacrament of Penance is administered every Saturday at 3:00 pm or by appointment at St. Sebastian Church.

### Rite of Christian initiation of adults and children (RCIA):

Adults interested in becoming Catholic participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation (RCIA). The Rite of Christian Initiation is a process of initiation into the Catholic Community of Faith. This is for persons who are seeking baptism in the Catholic Church or full communion with the Catholic tradition through the Profession of Faith, reception of Eucharist and Confirmation. If you are interested, please call the office.

### Sacrament of Marriage

A couple wishing to marry must contact the priest at least six months before the desired wedding date. According to the guidelines of our diocese, you should not make absolute plans for a specific wedding date until after meeting with the pastor. The couple will be required to attend a marriage preparation course which will include at least one formal program such as an Engaged Encounter weekend of the Sponsor Couple Program.

### Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

Toward the end last weekend's Gospel Jesus said to Peter, "O you of little faith, why did you doubt." Toward the end todays Gospel, Jesus says to the Canaanite woman, "O woman, great is your faith! Let it be done for you as you wish." The Gospel of last weekend revealed to us the lack of faith the disciples of Jesus had, despite their close relationship with Him. The Gospel of today reveals to us the great faith of the woman in Jesus who might have just heard about Jesus. Dear friends, through this comparison of the Gospels I would like you to reflect about our faith in Jesus. We are said to be the followers of Jesus but, how deep is our faith in Jesus? Forget about our faith in Jesus, how much faith we have in our brothers and sisters?

Anyone who reads this Gospel passage with a critical mind might raise a question-ls the scripture supporting racism? Otherwise, why should the scripture mention the community of the woman as Canaanite woman? When we are reading the Gospel, at several places we can see the scripture is mentioning the community of certain people. By this the scripture is not promoting any racism, but rather highlighting the faith of the people in Jesus and most of the time the non-Jewish people had more faith in Jesus than the real Jews. Jesus Himself confirms this truth: Jesus says in John 1: 11, "He came to His own and His own did not receive Him." In the Gospel of Luke 4: 24 Jesus says, "Truly I tell you; no prophet is accepted in his hometown." When Jesus appreciates the faith of the non-Jewish community people, it was a lesson for His own disciples too. Keep in mind the faith of the disciples in the last weekend's Gospel as well as in many other occasions.

In today's Gospel we see that Jesus is trying to avoid this Canaanite woman three times. At first when the woman calls out for help, we see that Jesus without saying anything ignores her. In our personal life, how many times have we complained that the Lord is not answering our prayers? In the second place we see that the disciples are taking initiative to request the Lord to send the woman away. Jesus ignores the woman by saying, "I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel." Jesus tells her that, He came for the people of Israel, and you don't belong to Jewish community. In our personal life, like the disciples, how many times and how many people have discouraged us from praying to the Lord and supported us to give priority to many other worldly things? How many times have we blamed God for not answering our prayers according to our time and convenience? In the third time we see that Jesus tries to discourage the woman by saying, "It is not right to take the food of the children and throw it to the dogs." Some people view this comment that

Jesus made as very insulting. However, at the end we see that the faith of the Canaanite woman wins the heart of Jesus and receive the needed blessings.

Dear friends, if we have true faith in Jesus, be sure we will be insulted because of our faith in Jesus. Jesus Himself was questioned and insulted for being faithful to His father in Heaven. In our personal life, how many times have you been insulted by others when you encouraged them to go to Church, sending kids to Faith Formation etc. Remember the warning of Jesus, "On *My account, you will be brought before governors and kings as witnesses to them and to the Gentiles.*" (Matthew 10:18) However, during this kind of situation what we need is the true faith like the Canaanite woman. Remember the story of the rude Judge and the poor widow through which Jesus reminds us that we should pray always and never give up.

Before we think anything negative about Jesus for His attitude towards the Canaanite woman, we should understand that the very moment the woman came before Jesus, He knew the depth of her faith in Him. However, Jesus had two intentions, one is to test her faith and second is to teach His disciples about the quality of faith one should have. Yes, it is not enough that we walk around in the label of Jesus as Christians or as Catholics, but rather we should be consistent in our faith in Jesus. At the same time the Gospel reminds us that and everyone who has faith can experience Jesus without any kind of discrimination too. God bless.
